Thank you for your interest in the role of Science Teacher at Arnold House.

Arnold House was founded in 1905 in St John's Wood. It is an independent preparatory school for boys from 5 to 13, and a member of IAPS (the Independent Association of Preparatory Schools).

Arnold House aims to provide an education of breadth and excellence and to serve the boys' best interests across the ability range. We aim to do so in a supportive, purposeful and stimulating environment, to provide a foundation for the boys' development within a Christian ethos, to help them mature into well-rounded individuals by developing their enjoyment of music, the arts and sport, and to promote good citizenship through

the virtues of courtesy and industry.

The School's strengths include:

- a broad and balanced all-round education
- boys are encouraged to develop as individuals
- a strong academic tradition
- a recognition that the School has a religious life
- an underlying spirit of tolerance
- kindness and good manners exemplified in relations between boys, staff and parents
- traditional values
- a spirit of competition
- strong pastoral care
- a happy family-oriented school.

Boys move on to many of the UK's top independent senior schools,

including City of London, Eton, Harrow, Marlborough, Mill Hill, Radley, Rugby, St Paul's, Tonbridge, UCS, Westminster and Winchester.

Science at Arnold House

Science is taught from Year 1 to Year 8. In Years 1 to 4, Form Teachers teach Science in their classrooms. In Years 5 to 8, specialist Science teachers take their lessons in the Science Laboratory.

Pupils are prepared for the 13+ Common Entrance and Scholarship exams in Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

The aims of the Science Department

- to stimulate boys' curiosity, interest and enjoyment in Science.
- to enable boys to be familiar with a wide ranging body of scientific knowledge and vocabulary.

- to enable boys to understand and use scientific methods safely.
- to enable boys to work independently and in partnership with others.
- to develop a sense of awareness for the relevance and implications of Science, past, present and future, for the individual, the community and the environment.

In the May half term we will be leading a STEM trip for boys in Years 6 and 7 to Eurospace in Belgium and Amsterdam, to consolidate interest in the STEM subjects. We are hoping this visit will become an annual fixture.



Supplementary Information

We are seeking to recruit an enthusiastic and committed Science Teacher to join this important and developing department at Arnold House.

The Science Teacher will work with the Head of Science. You will teach boys in Years 5 to 8 towards Common Entrance and Scholarship Examinations in Biology, Chemistry and Physics at the age of 13. There are two other members of the department with whom the Head of Science and Science Teacher share the teaching.

There is a fully equipped Science laboratory in which to teach the two parallel classes in each year group in Years 5 to 8. Each class in Years 6, 7 and 8 has the equivalent of five 35-minute periods a week,

one of which is a double period of 70 minutes. Year 5 have one double and two single periods per week. You will have a generous amount of planning and preparation time.

The boys are highly motivated and enthusiastic.

The laboratory has movable tables and chairs with fixed benches around the sides suitable for practical work. There is a Store/ Prep Room attached to the laboratory in which a dishwasher and small fridge/freezer are located. The laboratory is fitted with an interactive whiteboard.

The laboratory will be completely refurbished over summer holidays, ready for our return to School in September 2018.

Teachers at Arnold House are paid according to the School's own highly competitive salary scale. Arnold House's salary scale is set generously above the maintained sector's scale for London teachers, both in recognition of the higher cost of living in London and of the fact that teachers 'go the extra mile' in a school such as ours by contributing to sports, drama productions, trips, clubs and other activities. All teachers take a share in supervisory duties and enjoy the benefit of a number of non-contact periods each week which they can use for lesson preparation, marking etc.

All staff are appraised regularly and are encouraged to reflect on and develop their practice.

Job Description

All teachers at Arnold House share these responsibilities:

- to put the interests of pupils before all other considerations
- to prepare lessons to a high standard
- to correct work carefully and thoroughly, giving feedback to progress learning
- to teach in a manner appropriate to the needs of pupils and to provide appropriate differentiation in their teaching
- to keep records in the form of mark books and reports
- to set an example in behaviour, manner, efficiency, professionalism and presentation
- to undertake regular INSET and to keep abreast of appropriate developments in the teaching of science
- to keep a careful check on the use of educational resources

- within their control
- to make their classrooms attractive and welcoming places of learning
- to extend learning beyond the classroom by means of research, homework and outings
- to abide by and contribute to the development of whole-school policies
- to be aware of the pastoral needs of the pupils and to have regard for their safety and happiness at school and to be vigilant for signs of bullying or abuse
- to take a share in the general school duties shared amongst the members of the Common Room
- to attend school functions and concerts
- to participate in the School's extra-curricular activities according to their talents and interests

- to work co-operatively with other colleagues and senior managers
- to attend and contribute constructively to staff meetings
- to help review policies and to participate in working parties
- to take responsibility for the development of their own careers, through training, the acceptance of additional responsibilities and carefully considered career moves
- to deal professionally with parents and other educational professionals such as child psychologists
- to promote the best interest of the school through the excellence of their own work and courtesy shown to visiting members of the public, prospective and present parents, and other educational professionals.
