Job Description





All teaching staff will be responsible to the appropriate Head of Department or Faculty for their teaching role and to the appropriate Head of Year for their pastoral role.

"All teaching staff shall perform, in accordance with any direction which may reasonably be given to him by the Headteacher from time to time, such particular duties as may reasonably be assigned to them'."

1. Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils

- establish a safe and stimulating environment for pupils, rooted in mutual respect
- set goals that stretch and challenge pupils of all backgrounds, abilities and dispositions
- demonstrate consistently the positive attitudes, values and behaviour which are expected of pupils.

2. Promote good progress and outcomes by pupils

- be accountable for pupils' attainment, progress and outcomes
- be aware of pupils' capabilities and their prior knowledge, and plan teaching to build on these
- quide pupils to reflect on the progress they have made and their emerging needs
- demonstrate knowledge and understanding of how pupils learn and how this impacts on teaching
- encourage pupils to take a responsible and conscientious attitude to their own work and study.

3. Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge

- have a secure knowledge of the relevant subject(s) and curriculum areas, foster and maintain pupils' interest in the subject, and address misunderstandings
- demonstrate a critical understanding of developments in the subject and curriculum areas, and promote the value of scholarship
- demonstrate an understanding of and take responsibility for promoting high standards of literacy, articulacy and the correct use of standard English, whatever the teacher's specialist subject
- if teaching early reading, demonstrate a clear understanding of systematic synthetic phonics
- if teaching early mathematics, demonstrate a clear understanding of appropriate teaching strategies.

4. Plan and teach well structured lessons

- impart knowledge and develop understanding through effective use of lesson time
- · promote a love of learning and children's intellectual curiosity
- set homework and plan other out-of-class activities to consolidate and extend the knowledge and understanding pupils have acquired
- · reflect systematically on the effectiveness of lessons and approaches to teaching
- contribute to the design and provision of an engaging curriculum within the relevant subject area(s).

5. Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of all pupils

- know when and how to differentiate appropriately, using approaches which enable pupils to be taught effectively
- have a secure understanding of how a range of factors can inhibit pupils' ability to learn, and how best to overcome these
- demonstrate an awareness of the physical, social and intellectual development of children, and know how to adapt teaching to support pupils' education at different stages of development
- have a clear understanding of the needs of all pupils, including those with special educational needs; those of high ability; those with English as an additional language; those with disabilities; and be able to use and evaluate distinctive teaching approaches to engage and support them.

6. Make accurate and productive use of assessment

- know and understand how to assess the relevant subject and curriculum areas, including statutory assessment requirements
- make use of formative and summative assessment to secure pupils' progress
- use relevant data to monitor progress, set targets, and plan subsequent lessons
- give pupils regular feedback, both orally and through accurate marking, and encourage pupils to respond to the feedback.

7. Manage behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning environment

- have clear rules and routines for behaviour in classrooms, and take responsibility for promoting good and courteous behaviour both in classrooms and around the school, in accordance with the school's behaviour policy
- have high expectations of behaviour, and establish a framework for discipline with a range of strategies, using praise, sanctions and rewards consistently and fairly

Physical Education Faculty



The Physical Education Faculty at Park High School has an outstanding reputation within the county. This reputation has been built up over several years.

At Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 all pupils have 2 x 1 hour Physical Education lessons per week. Key Stage 3 pupils are taught in mixed ability, single sex groups. They are taught a broad and balanced curriculum covering all areas of the PE curriculum. The behaviour, kit, participation record, attitude and performance of our pupils are outstanding. The pupils' work ethic is something we are extremely proud of.

At Key Stage 4 pupils are given more choice to specialise and have the opportunity to select activities in Core PE lessons. At Key Stage 4 pupils have the option to study GCSE, Vocational PE and GCSE Health & Social Care. The PE department also has the responsibility for delivering the school's Personal Development curriculum.

Extra-curricular activities play a vital role in the PE department. We have a participation policy whereby practices and clubs are open to all pupils regardless of their ability. All clubs and practices are very well attended by both boys and girls. We have school teams in 12 different competitive sports competing successfully at both District and County Level.

The department has an excellent sports hall, dance studio, two trampolines, two grass football pitches, an all-weather surface & five netball courts. We also use facilities within the local area.
