BTEC Level 3 Health and Social Care

The BTEC Level 3 National Diploma in Health and Social Care started at Coloma in September this year. This is equivalent to two A-Levels and is designed to prepare young people for the broad range of careers in the health and social care sector. As part of the course, students are required to complete 100 hours of work experience. Our students completed their first placements in November. Orannii Edwards-Richardson and Ellie Burrett attended Whitgift House Care Home, Michalina Dziuba and Felicity Appiah went to Cranmer Court (a Nursing Home in Warlingham), Habibah Ali went to The Ark Montessori Nursery in Thornton Heath and Gabriela Kaska to The Portland Hospital in London. They had the opportunity to shadow a range of health and social care staff, observe how health and safety procedures were put into practice and interact with a range of children and people with complex needs. Activities included helping residents to make Christmas decorations and bake.

German Embassy Careers Fair 2017

Once again, Year 12 German students from Coloma participated in the German Embassy Careers Fair, organised jointly by the German Embassy and the German-British Chamber of Industry & Commerce at the London School of Economics. The fair enables students to find out about the many exciting opportunities offered to young Britons with German language skills both by German companies in the UK and Germany as well as British companies with strong links to Germany. It was fascinating to talk to representatives from Siemens, Bosch, Lidl and Commerzbank and to learn about their internship and graduate/

management trainee programmes. Students also found out about the exciting prospect of studying in Germany. Language learning organisations such as Goethe-Institut and DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) were on hand to give really useful advice on further improving German language skills and applying to German universities. The Coloma students were also pleased to take advantage of the opportunity to improve their German interview skills, and we all went away with plenty of inspiration and ideas about how to put our German skills to best use!
