We are seeking an experienced International School Counsellor to join our well-established and dynamic team. The successful candidate will be working with Nursery to Year 13 students and their families. The School Counselling model at Tanglin is primarily a therapeutic one-to-one service catering to the social-emotional needs of our students, working as an integral part of the Pastoral System within the School. We are seeking an individual who is responsive and adaptable with excellent interpersonal skills who has current knowledge and up to date training in the counselling field. Please note that we will only accept applications from candidates who hold a relevant Master's Degree.

Key Responsibilities

- 1. To support Tanglin students and their families.
- 2. To work collaboratively within the School Counselling Department.
- 3. To plan appropriate interventions and maintain suitable case records for students from Nursery to Year 13.
- 4. To provide a confidential counselling service in accordance with SAC Ethical Guidelines.
- 5. To attend supervision according to the School Counselling policy.
- 6. To refer clients to other professionals when appropriate.
- 7. To be an active part of the Crisis Intervention Team as required.
- 8. To liaise with the relevant Child Protection Officers from each school as necessary.
- 9. To work within and contribute to the school framework, linking with appropriate members of staff, as needed (nursing staff, librarian, tutors, class teachers, subject teachers, Heads of Year etc...).
- 10. To attend departmental, pastoral and other relevant meetings within the wider community.
- 11. To attend professional development courses as required by SAC guidelines.
- 12. To be involved with the facilitation and presentation of Parenting Workshops.
- 13. To offer timely year-group assemblies, class circle times and relevant workshops within the school community.





Personal Attributes

- 14. Be outgoing and positive when working with students, teachers and members of the school community.
- 15. Possess a pleasant disposition with excellent interpersonal, organizational and communication skills.
- 16. Be able to work independently as well as within a team and show good initiative.
- 17. Have a disciplined approach to attendance and punctuality.

Pre-requisites

- A passion for supporting student's social emotional needs.
- A Master's Degree in Counselling or equivalent. Experience of counselling students in an International School setting.
- Membership or working towards membership of a professional counselling body.
- An active interest in keeping abreast of current developments in the counselling field.

Desirable

- Additional qualifications in a Strength-Based Counselling modality, for example Solution Focused Therapy.
- Experience of or interest in working a variety of expressive mediums, for example, sand, art or play therapy.
- A personal practice of mindfulness or contemplative practices and experience of weaving these into client sessions.
- A working understanding of the issues facing Third Culture Kids (TCK's) and their families. Knowledge and experience of facilitating a parenting programme.
- Experience within a classroom setting and delivering presentations to larger groups.
