To deliver this, we focus on encouraging and nurturing Resilience, Empathy, Aspiration, Contribution and Happiness in all of our children and young people. We also have the highest expectations of the staff in our family: responsibility

and leadership; aspiration and development; honesty and integrity; enjoyment and innovation; and collaboration and inclusion. These values are used as a measure of progress with individuals, schools and overall as a trust.

High Aspirations for All

At Astrea Academy Sheffield, we have the highest aspirations for our pupils and our teachers. With dedication, hard work and belief there is nothing that cannot be achieved. We set high expectations for the behaviour of all pupils and believe that excellent behaviour is the foundation of a successful school where pupils respect one another and fulfil their role within a learning community. This extends from the way pupils wear their uniform to the way they interact with peers and teachers. As pupils progress through the school, they take on additional responsibilities and from Key Stage 4 have the opportunity to fulfil leadership roles across the school. Our three school rules are simple. We expect all pupils to show Respect, Resilience and Responsibility.

Our school rewards system recognises and celebrates pupils who accept challenges and push themselves to do their very best – we have high expectations for every child. From a young age, children will learn about career opportunities and discuss their ambitions. All pupils need to understand what is available and appreciate that they are entitled to it all, no matter what their background. From a young age, pupils will learn about university, the opportunities higher education presents and when, rather than if, they go.





An Inclusive Education

At every stage from the age of 2, to the age of 18, we ensure an inclusive and fully supportive approach to ensure we meet the needs of all students, including those who are, or have been looked after, those with special educational needs and disabilities and those who are able and/or gifted. The early identification of vulnerable 2 year olds, and outreach work with families of 2-4 year olds in their homes prior to the start of school, are both essential areas of our approach and a reflection of our commitment to meeting the individual needs of every child.

We believe that every child and young person matters and all pupils have a common entitlement to a broad and balanced curriculum integrated in to all aspects of Academy life. We ensure that pupils of all abilities have the opportunity to flourish. We welcome students of all abilities and from all backgrounds; our teachers will take the time to get to know and understand every

individual. Whether they are doing very well, are struggling in an area of learning or need extra emotional or pastoral support, we will always work to meet their needs. It is crucial to identify a special educational need as early as possible and quickly implement strategies that support learning to promote achievement and attainment in all pupils.

At the first stage of a child's formal education or the point at which they join the school, we work effectively with all other agencies supporting children and their parents, to enable early identification of any holistic needs, including: paediatricians, GPs, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, sensory impairment specialists, speech and language therapists, educational psychologists, health visitors, children's centres, portage, social and welfare services and any specialist or support services. Early identification enables us to close any gap before it has the chance to grow, which is particularly important in the case of speech and

language development, which affect all other areas of learning.

Where pupils are underachieving and/or identified as having special educational needs, the school will provide for these additional needs in a variety of ways and will use a combination of these approaches to address targets identified for individual pupils.

The Astrea Academy Proposed School Day

Astrea Academy Sheffield operates an extended school day providing all pupils with a broad and balanced curriculum. We ask that all pupils arrive for breakfast with their teachers – a positive start to the day and an opportunity to ensure all pupils are fully prepared and ready to learn.

The school day offers three points of contact between pupils and their form tutor. Throughout the week this time is given to develop reading skills, study skills, knowledge retention and tailored subject support in small groups. A reflection session at the end of every day ensures all pupils review their learning, identify areas for development and celebrate their progress and achievements.

During period 6 all pupils will take part in the enrichment programme involving a range of sports, clubs,

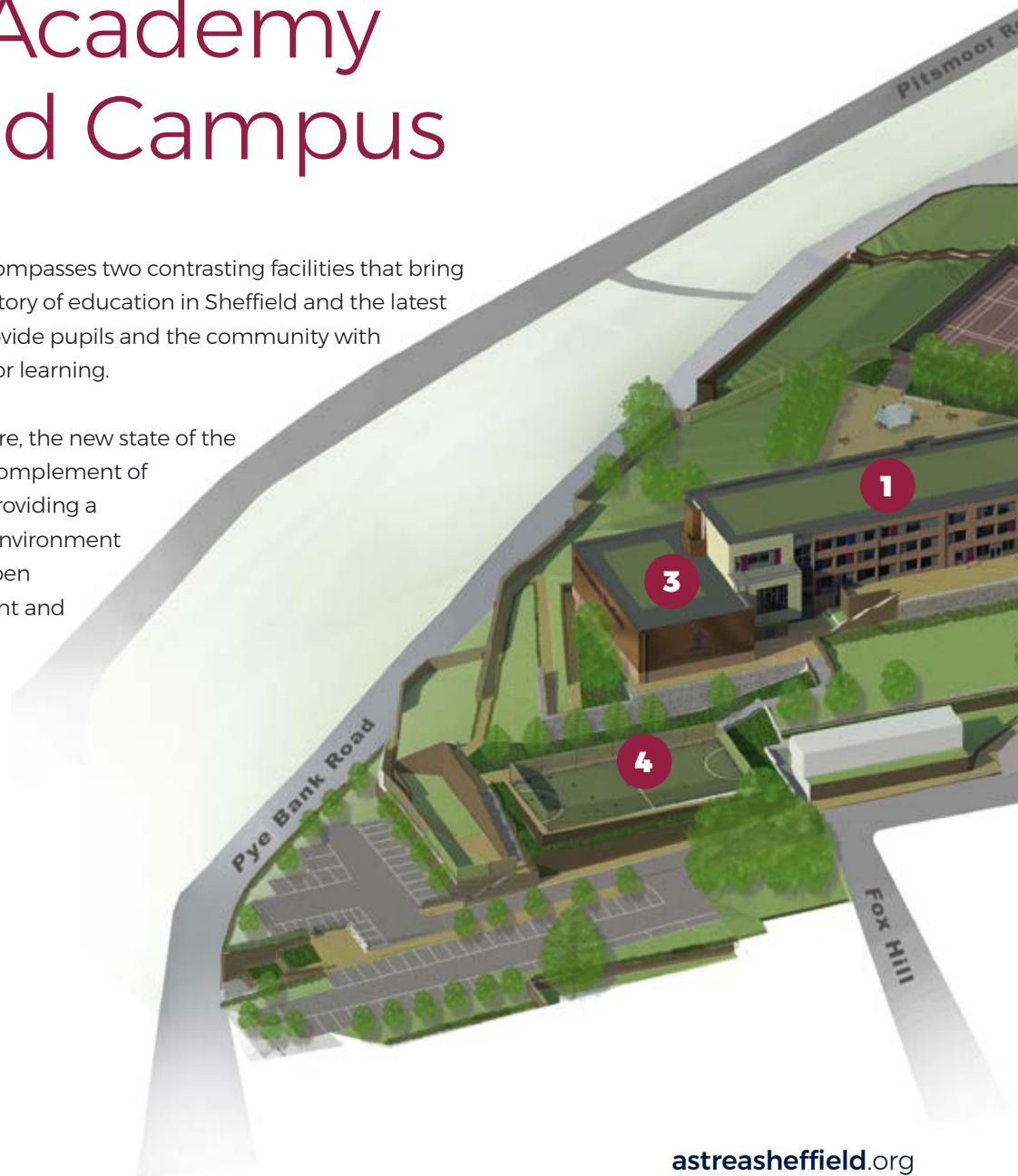
- camp in a field or a forest

- perform in an Astrea concert.

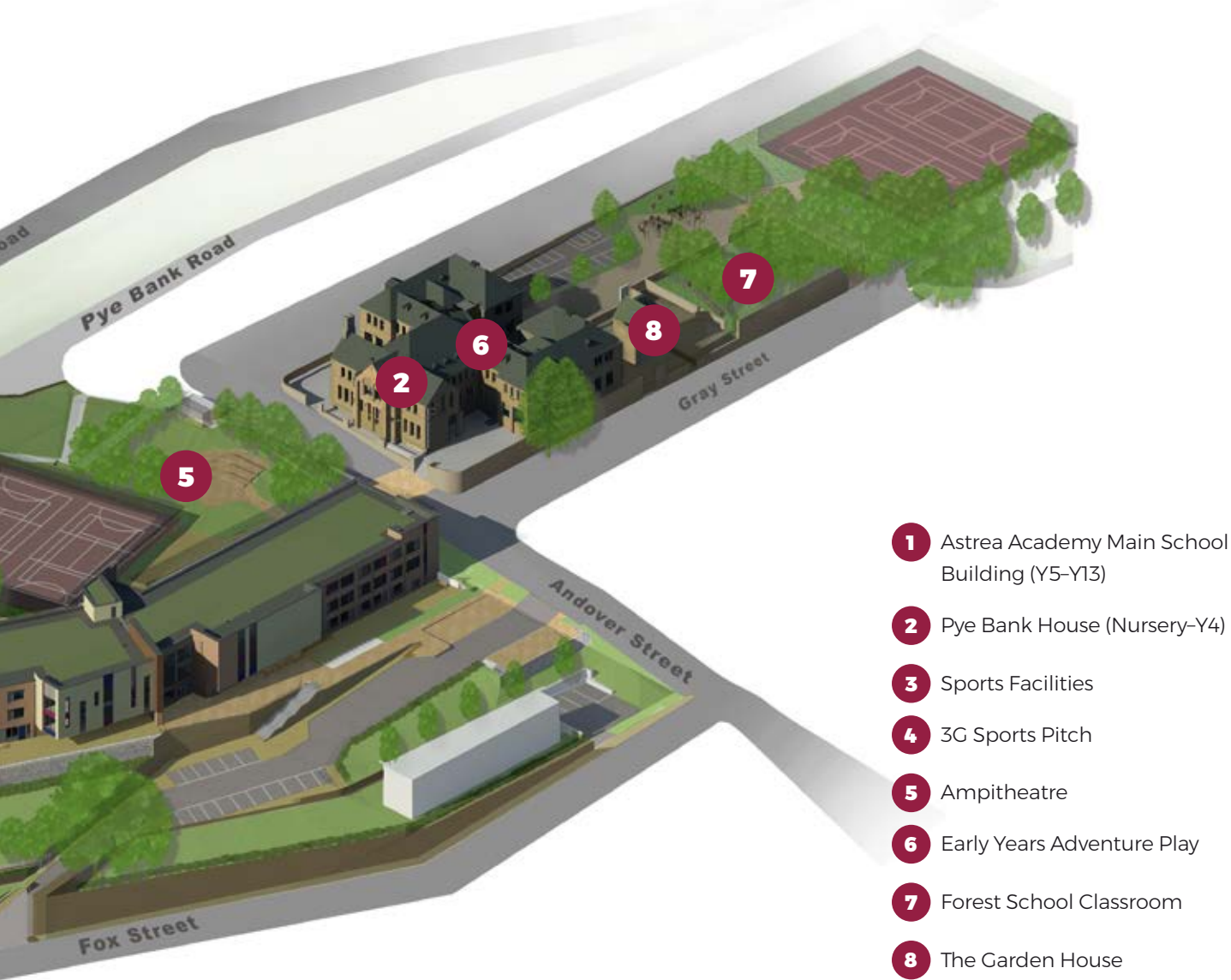


Astrea Academy Sheffield Campus

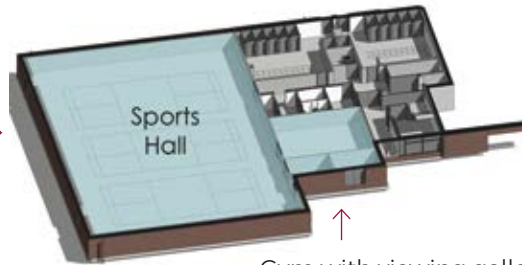
- 1** Astrea Academy Main School Building (Y5–Y13)

Three-court sports hall with excellent facilities for indoor sports including basketball, badminton, netball, football and gymnastics

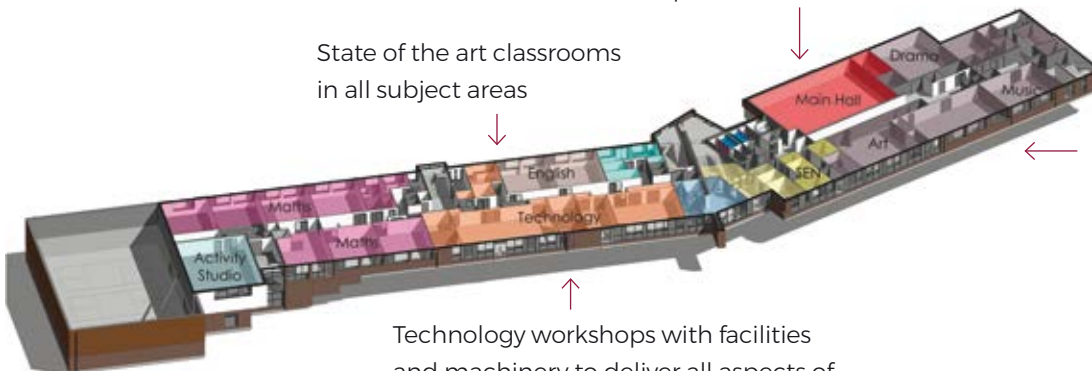


Gym with viewing gallery of the Sports Hall

Several large learning spaces including Main Hall, Drama Studio and Lecture Theatre for assemblies and whole-school performances and celebrations

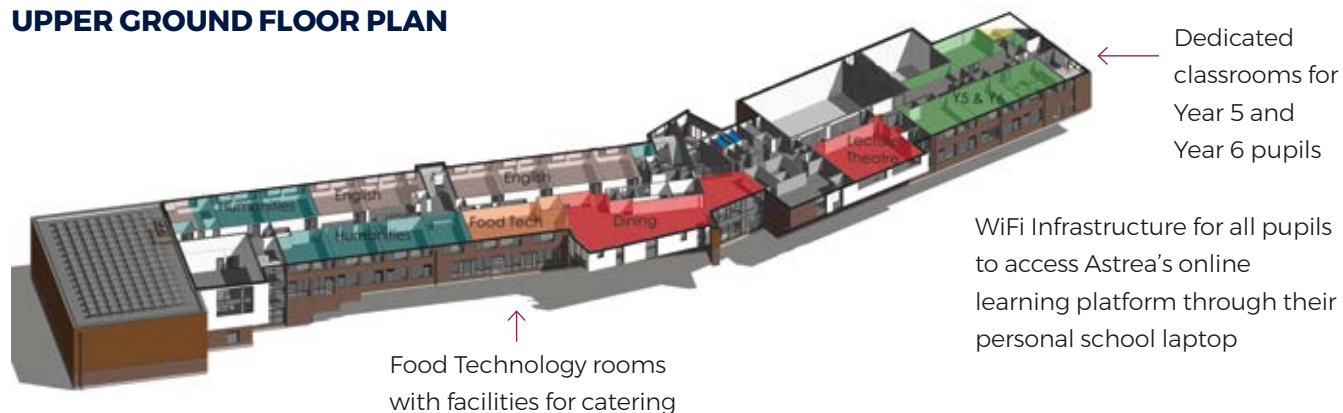

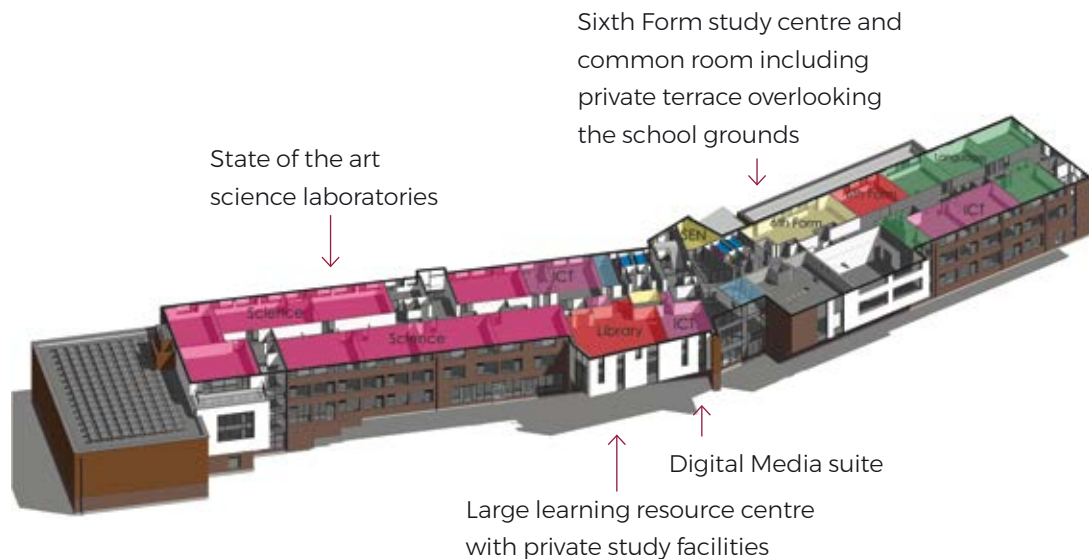

Industry and Community Partnerships

Our curriculum is designed to provide opportunities for pupils to work closely with local businesses and organisations. This will include opportunities for pupils to visit and work in the local area, complete projects linked to a variety of industries and gain industry specific qualifications along the way leading to training and employment. Each

term pupils will take part in a 'Big Problem' themed day. These days engage pupils in some of the problems and issues facing society and allow them to apply the knowledge and skills they have developed across the term, managing an extended task in a real-world context. Our partnerships with the local community will be a

focus of these days and create further opportunities to deliver the school's careers education programme and the Astrea Promise.

The Enrichment Programme

Everyday offers opportunities for pupils to engage in enrichment activities developing skills, interests and knowledge in a wide range of areas. This includes a range of sports, clubs, debating, creative arts,

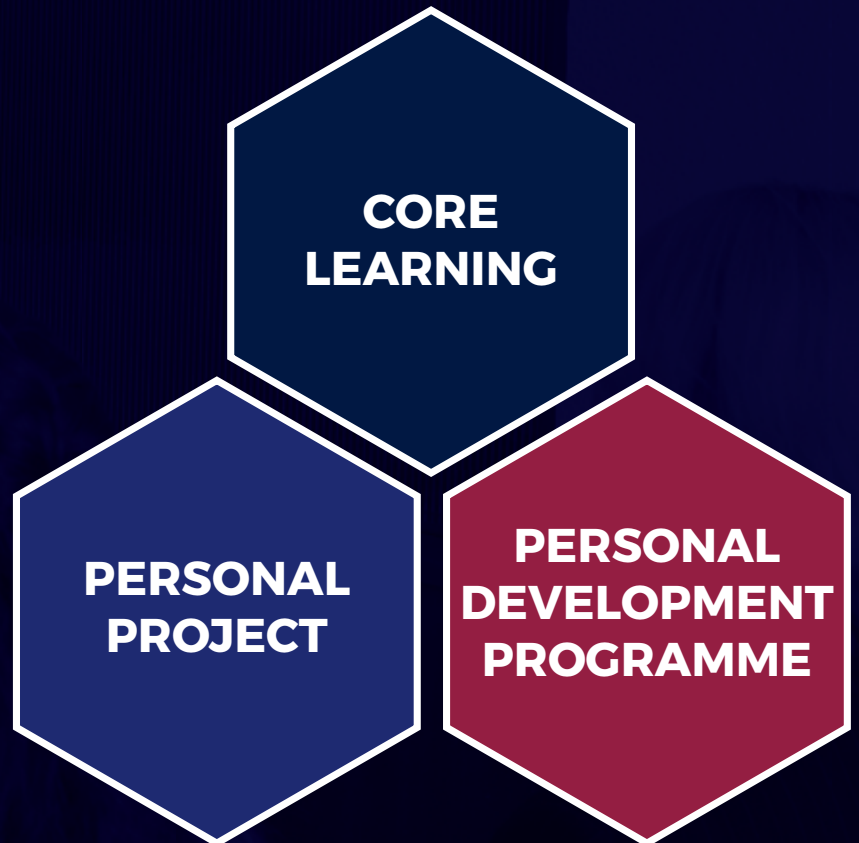
enterprise projects, additional languages and personal projects linked to the Astrea Baccalaureate.

Astrea Academy Sheffield Sixth Form

Astrea Academy Sixth Form will provide an aspirational choice for students in the north of the city and a natural progression for Astrea Academy pupils into further education. With a team of expert teachers that know our students and their aspirations, the Astrea Academy Sixth Form will provide a bridge to university with exceptional careers and higher education advice and support. The Sixth Form will provide students with new freedoms and new responsibilities, as well as the opportunity to take a leading role in the school. Including supporting younger pupils with reading, holding positions as House Captains, Subject Leaders, Sports Leaders or setting up and running their own clubs and school events – our Sixth Formers act as role models for pupils across the academy.

Our Sixth Form curriculum will place a premium on independent study, discussion and the development of ideas. All students will study 3 A levels subjects or similar qualifications including Level 3 BTEC and engage in a personal development programme covering leadership, wellbeing, cultural, creative and community initiatives.

With excellent teachers and a supportive learning environment, including a dedicated Sixth Form lounge, careers library and private study facilities, the Sixth Form is the culmination of an exceptional all-through education.





How to apply for a place at Astrea Academy Sheffield

When choosing Astrea Academy Sheffield we highly recommend placing it as your first choice in order to have your best chance of obtaining a place. The indicated admissions number of Astrea Academy Sheffield is 150 places for Year 7 in 2018.

Astrea Academy Sheffield is part of Sheffield County Council's admissions scheme. To apply for a place in September 2018, parents must select Astrea Academy Sheffield as a preference on the online admissions portal or a hard copy application form, enclosed with this brochure.

Some families were unaware that Astrea Academy Sheffield was a secondary option for their child. Any families wanting to choose Astrea Academy Sheffield, that have already submitted admissions forms are able to amend their choices by contacting Sheffield Admissions and submitting

a new application in one of the following ways:

1. If you have already applied online, login to the admissions portal with your username and password. Click 'amend' and update your preferences.
2. If you have sent a hard copy you can:
 - email ed-admissions@sheffield.gov.uk with your child's name, date of birth, address, current school and your amended preferences by 31st October.
 - Or, write to pupil admissions stating that you would like to amend your preferences.
