We require an English teacher for our ambitious, popular and successful English Department. The Department has been twice externally evaluated as 'outstanding' by a practising Ofsted inspector (April, 2014; 2016). Our Progress 8 score for 2016 for English put us in the top 9% nationally for all students. We are awaiting similar validation of our excellent progress in 2017.

We are teaching the new Edexcel GCSE syllabus for English Language and also for English Literature, and the new Edexcel A level syllabuses for English Literature and English Language and Literature. The Key Stage Three curriculum has been revised in order to provide secure preparation for the demands of the new GCSE English specification. We have mixed ability classes in Key stage 3, with an option for the least able to work in smaller withdrawal groups. At KS4 we have bespoke provision for the most able and the least able, with other classes being composed of wider, mixed ability groups. All students study English Literature as well as Language.

The English department offers AS and A2 courses in English Literature and English Language and Literature. All A level courses in the 6<sup>th</sup> form are highly popular and very successful.

Lampton School is a mixed, multi-ethnic 11-18 school that gained Academy status through the fast track 'outstanding' route in September 2010. We were awarded Teaching School status in July 2011. We have IIP Status. Lampton School was judged as "outstanding" in all categories by Ofsted in May 2008 and again in May 2013. It was also featured in the Ofsted report 'Twelve outstanding secondary schools – Excelling against the odds'. We have a large and expanding successful sixth form and have a new sixth form block where most A' level lessons are taught.
