

Job Description: Drama Teacher

This role reports to the Director of Drama.

Terms & Conditions: This is a part time (FTE 0.8) teaching Years 7-9 classes (Term time only) and working on productions and rehearsals. It will involve teaching 5 days a week and the candidate would need to be available for rehearsals 3 evenings from 4.00-6.00 pm and be available occasionally at weekends when required.

Scope of role

We are seeking a dynamic, innovative Teacher of Drama (maternity cover) at our highly successful school. We are looking for a teacher able to deliver high quality and engaging lessons. Formal vocational training for this discipline and experience of working with children is required (Experience of teaching Key stage 3 and 4). A proven track record as a director is desirable. Must be outgoing, have a good sense of humour and prepared to work as a team member. This is an exciting opportunity to join an enthusiastic drama department.

Main responsibilities

- The candidate should have a detailed knowledge and practical experience of a wide range of theatrical styles and genre.
- They should have an understanding and knowledge of play texts from a social, historical and cultural perspective
- They should have excellent and varied classroom practice and the ability to develop pupils aptitude for learning.
- The candidate will be able to promote the school's aims positively.
- They should be able to develop good personal relationships within a team and establish valuable and useful relationships with parents.
- They should have the ability to guide pupil initiated projects and give them the tools for independent exploration.
- Creating a happy, challenging and effective learning environment is most important.
- The successful candidate should be enthusiastic and approachable and demonstrate an ability to manage time effectively and prioritise tasks.

- Degree in Drama/ Performing Arts
- A passion for drama and a love of the theatre
- A strong work ethic and a willingness to commit to an extensive drama programme outside the classroom
- Experience of teaching Key stage 3 and 4
- They should be an experienced director who has the confidence, flair and stamina to manage a large production team
- Awareness of the statutory requirements concerning Equal Opportunities, Health and Safety, SEND and Child Protection.

- Adaptable in approach and willing to 'go the extra mile'
- Flexible and versatile, able to work with imagination and ingenuity supporting young people in their new skills and techniques
