Curriculum:

- At Key Stage 3, all pupils follow a 2-year curriculum structured and delivered according to the updated NC guidelines for English. Our main aim at KS3 is to provide a seamless 'five year mastery curriculum' into KS4, as the distinction between these Key Stages is now largely redundant
- Pupils will begin KS4 in Year 9 and study EDUQAS GCSE English Language and Literature (formerly WJEC)
- This year, year 10 students will be completing their GCSE English literature exams to allow for one year dedicated to each aspect of the GCSE English curriculum; they will complete language in year 11.
- At Key Stage 5, roughly a third of Rainhill High School Sixth Form students study English (AQA English Language B or AQA English Literature A
