The Computing Department:

The department consists of three full-time dedicated teachers. The department is friendly, co-operative, highly supportive and successful. Teaching spans across the age range from Year 7 to Year 13 with a large uptake at both GCSE and A-level. In Years 7 to 9 the students complete a series of assignments on a termly basis to provide them with an understanding of the difference between ICT, in terms of the creative aspects, and Computing. Those who select ICT as a Key Stage 4 option will complete the Creative iMedia qualification. Alternatively, they may choose to study GCSE Computing, following the OCR specification. At A-level, we offer the AQA Computer Science qualification.

ICT is well established throughout the school; there are six complete teaching rooms with over 400 computers across the site, an interactive whiteboard in almost every teaching room and an embedded VLE (Virtual Learning Environment) which can be used to provide teaching and learning beyond the confines of the classroom. This has been in place for ten years and it is used in numerous subject areas throughout the school.

The department is staffed by an enthusiastic team of subject specialists who enjoy good working relationships with the students. This is manifested in frequent structured discussions in class and many rewarding educational visits.
