MUSIC LEAD TEACHER

THE ROLE

The Old School Henstead seeks to appoint an inspirational Music Lead Teacher for a full-time teaching position commencing September 2019. You will be an exceptional teacher with excellent music skills and a passion for all things musical. You will hold a degree in Music and will manage the Music Department and its Peripatetic Music staff, as well as overseeing the programme of entries for Trinity College Music Examinations. The candidate will also run successful lower and upper school choirs, musical productions and other musical activities, including music in school church services and assemblies. Experience of stage direction for musical productions is desirable.

A willingness to play a full and active role in the daily life of a busy and vibrant prep school is a necessity, as is the desire to engage in regular professional development opportunities. Experience of teaching at Early Years, Key Stages 1 and 2 and a good level of ICT skills are desirable attributes. This is a suitable role for an experienced teacher leading music in a school, but may also suit an ambitious NQT with experience directing choirs or musicals, with an active network of musical contacts.

Principal Responsibilities:

- Manage all aspects of the Music curriculum, subjecting it to regular review, upgrading Schemes of Work in accordance to meeting requirements of external scholarship examinations or other assessments.
- Promote Music to pupils through a range of extra-curricular activities, trips and visits every year; through clubs, societies, inter-house competitions and musical events; and inviting guest speakers into School where appropriate.
- Run a successful School choir and other musical ensembles and attend all church services.

- Keep the Department up to date with the latest research, methods and syllabi for teaching and examining.
- Manage and develop the Music Rooms and all resources
- Encourage a high level of participation and achievement in Music examinations and Informal and Formal concerts.
- Liaise with Senior Schools to ensure a smooth transition and support any Music scholars.
- Liaise with parents including report writing at the end of each term.
- Promote the use of ICT in the Department
- Forge cross-curricular links with other Departments where appropriate

Assessment, Recording, Reporting

THE SCHOOL DAY.

The school day starts at 8.30 for Nursery children and 8.35 for pupils in Reception year upwards, with registration at 8.45am. Children may be pre-booked into the early morning Breakfast Club, which opens at 7.45am. Children arriving early (at any time between 8.15am and 8.35am) may be looked after until 8.35am, when they go to their classrooms.

- Morning break is from 10.50am to 11.10am
- Lunchtime starts at 12.00pm for the Early Years Foundation Stage up to 12.40pm for the Upper School.
- Afternoon break (lower school only) is from 2.30pm to 2.45pm.

Children in Reception to Year 2 who need to wait until 4.10pm are cared for in a supervised activity or prep session. After this additional care is provided until 5.30pm Monday to Friday for children in all year groups.

After School Clubs

A range of supervised activities takes place after school each day, for children in Reception upwards.

The activities on offer vary from term to term. Examples include: Mini-Engineers, Archery, Wire Sculpture, Spy School, Arts & Crafts, Computing, Athletics, Rugby, Rounders, Cricket, Football, Netball, Hockey, Multi-Sports, Unihoc, Dodgeball, Tennis and Pony Club.



TEACHING AND LEARNING.

The Old School Henstead is driven by our determination to provide pupils with a tailor-made learning experience of the highest standard. Whilst focussing on the core subjects, the teaching at The Old School Henstead is committed to ensuring that every pupil maximises their potential through inspiring, motivating and enriching learning opportunities. Our curriculum is designed to inspire and challenge all pupils, with teaching adapted to meet the varying needs of our students.

We aim to teach children how to grow into positive, responsible people, who can work and co-operate with others, whilst developing knowledge and skills in order to achieve their true potential. Above all, we believe in making learning fun. We believe in engendering a love of lifelong learning in every child that passes through the school.

Small class sizes, excellent teaching and an insistence on traditional values of hard work and good manners help all pupils at The Old School Henstead to achieve high academic standards.

We cater for pupils of all abilities, offering specialist support where needed at both ends of the ability spectrum.

In Early Years (Reception) and the Lower School (Years 1 and 2), the children are taught in their class base by their class teacher for the majority of subjects. In the Upper School, from Year 3 onwards, the majority of subjects are taught by subject teachers.

Assessment

Assessment for Learning plays a vital role in ensuring that every pupil makes excellent progress. We encourage pupils to take responsibility for their own learning, to be involved as far as possible in reviewing the way they learn, and to reflect on how they learn – what helps them learn and what makes it difficult for them to learn.

We ensure that every child knows where they currently are in their learning and what they need to do in order to improve.

Assessment takes many forms at The Old School Henstead: from informal classroom discussions and the marking of pupils' work to the data provided by thorough standardised assessments. We believe that to really assess children, you must first try to understand them for who they are – individuals.



PASTORAL.

Assemblies

Assemblies are an important starting point of the day at The Old School Henstead. Our assemblies are designed to inspire pupils to appreciate all that life has to offer and to settle for nothing less than their very best. Every morning children from Reception upwards attend assemblies which are themed – on a termly basis – around the Christian ethos and core values of the school. In addition to whole school assemblies, there are also House assemblies, Show and Tell assemblies and pupil-led form assemblies.

Forms

The Form Teacher (Early Years and Lower School) or Form Tutor (Upper School) plays a vital role in the daily life of each pupil. The Form Teachers and Tutors are the first point of contact for any queries or concerns.

Pupils are registered by the Form Teachers and Tutors every morning and spend time together at the end of each day. Contact with Form Teachers and Tutors is encouraged and can be arranged through the school planner (Years 3 to 6), message book (Reception to Year 2), via email or in person at the beginning or end of day. Regular form updates are posted on the form's *Schoology* page. Each form has a mascot that is awarded weekly to the pupil who best demonstrates the core values of the school.

Houses

The school has an active house system that encourages pupils to interact and collaborate with pupils outside their own year group. Weekly house assemblies form a basis for a wide range of house activities including sports competitions, artistic and cultural pursuits. House points are awarded

for good work and behaviour, which contribute to the end of year award of the Inter-house Cup.

School Council

The School Council has two representatives from every year from Year 1 to Year 6, with Reception joining in the Summer Term. New representatives are elected every term. Designed to give all the children in the school a voice, class representatives meet every week to inform the Council of any issues or ideas generated by their classes. There are often good suggestions for improvements around the school and in the classrooms, plus some wonderful ideas for learning. Minutes are taken, which are communicated to the Headmaster. It is a real opportunity for the boys and girls to contribute to the development of the life of the school.

The Arts - Music









Music making is a very important part of life at The Old School Henstead.

The School Choirs rehearse every week and lead the singing in the daily assembly and at our regular services at St Mary's Church. In addition to this we have, over the years, been very proud of the achievements of the choir at local, regional and national music festivals. The choir also frequently sings at local events and have raised money for many charities including CLIC Sargent, Children in Need and East Anglian Air Ambulance.

Every child also has weekly music lessons with our specialist music teachers. Children all learn to play the recorder during these lessons and many children also take advantage of the many peripatetic music teachers who visit the school to receive specialist tuition in piano, voice, woodwind, brass, strings, guitar, ukulele and percussion.

In keeping with The Old School Henstead's focus on building our pupils' confidence, social skills and awareness of others, the Drama syllabus provides an approach which is both structured and adventurous. With drama games, improvisations, role play and practice of specific elements of Drama, the children are equipped to meet not only the challenges of regular performance and presentation within the broader curriculum of the school, but also in their ensuing educational experience.

The Junior and Senior Summer Shows, our traditional climax to the year, are produced at an exceptional level of professionalism by talented and dedicated staff and include every child from Nursery to the top of the Senior School, at an appropriate level of performance. The Shows always provide a memorable send off for our leavers.

We also offer LAMDA tuition in the Upper School.
