GCSE RESULTS SHOW OUR CONTINUING IMPROVEMENT

SOUTH WIRRAL HIGH SCHOOL IS CELEBRATING ANOTHER YEAR OF STRONG EXAMINATION RESULTS ACROSS ALL CURRICULUM AREAS, BUT PARTICULARLY AT THE TOP GRADES OF 9-7. THIS YEAR TWICE AS MANY STUDENTS ACHIEVED THOSE GRADES AS DID LAST YEAR.

The results show the school's strength in depth across the whole curriculum and reinforces our desire to develop successful learners, who are also confident individuals and active citizens.

In the new grading system a grade 4 is equivalent to a C grade and a grade 7 is equivalent to an A grade. 77% of all students got grade 4 (a C) or above in English Language or Literature which is 3% higher than last year. 62% got a grade 4 or above in Maths which is similar to last year. 59% of our students got a grade 4 or better in both English and Maths which is 3% better than last year. 70% of all grades

were at grade 4 or above. The school has a strong 3 year upward trend in student attainment.

Staff, students and parents celebrated success on GCSE results day. There were many outstanding individual achievements with so many top grades but particular congratulations go to the highest attaining students in the newly reformed GCSEs. Aiden Street got a grade 9 in English Language. Adam Dawson in Chemistry and Physics,

and Lucas Kershaw in Drama.

Congratulations also to Shannah Dickson and Rachel Pinch for grade 8s in Art. All the results are just reward for the hard work that has been put in over five years.

These GCSE results come a week after excellent A Level results. We wish all our students every success in the future, as they seek to further their learning or take up apprenticeships or employment.

1 3 year 12 Sports Science students completed the training on this day, with all other South Wirral students receiving training in their life studies lessons in the forthcoming weeks.

We spoke to a few students about their experiences during the session, and on why it's important to know these life skills:

"If a family member ever had a heart attack, you'd want to know what to do to be able to help - especially if you're the only person around."

"It's important to learn CPR because it's a skill you could need at any time - without warning"

"I've thankfully never been in a situation like that before, I imagine it's very different just practicing compared to in real life"

A huge thank you to the British Heart Foundation for their 'call, push, rescue' packs that will be a fantastic resource for enabling the rest of the school to complete the training.

‘LOOK AT LIFE’ ROYAL MARINES COURSE

SIXTH FORM STUDENT OLIVIA ELLISON-BURKHILL, A MEMBER OF OUR UNIFIED SPORTS GROUP, RECENTLY TOOK PART IN AN EXCITING OPPORTUNITY AT A COMMANDO TRAINING CENTRE IN DEVON, WE ASKED HER TO TELL US ABOUT HER EXPERIENCE.

“On the 3rd September, I was part of a group that travelled down to Lymington Commando Training Centre Royal Marines to experience a ‘look at life’ course. There we were taught the core values of demonstrating excellence, integrity, self-discipline and humility in every task we were set. During our training week, we were also educated about the spirit and mindset that has to be executed at all times as a Royal Marines Commando. This included courage, determination, unselfishness and cheerfulness – to be being the first to understand, the first to adapt and respond and the first to overcome.

The week consisted of the training that you would have to pass in order to become a Royal Marines Commando. One part of this was the endurance course – which included crossing the rough moorland of Woodbury Common,

travelling through tunnels, pipes, wading pools and an underwater culvert.

Not only was this course an opportunity to explore the different career paths available within the armed forces, it was also a chance to encourage teamwork and leadership amongst each other just like we could on a rugby pitch.”

STUDENTS SAY 'HELLO YELLOW' ON WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY

ON 10TH OCTOBER, WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY, STAFF AND STUDENTS WORE SOMETHING YELLOW TO SCHOOL TO SUPPORT YOUNG MINDS AND SPREAD THE WORD THAT WHATEVER A PERSON IS GOING THROUGH, THERE'S SOMEONE TO TALK TO IF THEY'RE STRUGGLING TO COPE.

1 in 10 children & young people aged 5-16 suffer from a diagnosable mental health problem such as depression, anxiety or even an eating disorder. That's around 3 children in every classroom! 10% of young people deliberately harm themselves regularly. ¾ of long lasting mental ill health starts before the age of 18.

Our#HelloYellow day was a great success, not only in the fact we raised just over £310 but also that it created talking points. Our students were asking questions about mental health and sharing their thoughts in an open and supportive environment. There was lots of opportunities to educate our students on mental

health but we also had lots of fun too in our staff vs students penalty shootout and in our mindfulness activities like yellow art & photography, paint a pebble and chill out dance.

We hope to make this an annual event and make it even bigger & better next year.

TO RAISE AWARENESS FOR WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY, THE ART ROOMS WERE OPEN AT LUNCHTIME ON WEDNESDAY 10TH OCTOBER FOR STUDENTS TO COMPLETE SOME CREATIVE, MINDFULNESS ARTWORK.

SIXTH FORM @ SOUTH WIRRAL CELEBRATES MORE EXCELLENT A LEVEL AND BTEC RESULTS

YET AGAIN SIXTH FORM STUDENTS AT SOUTH WIRRAL HIGH SCHOOL WERE CELEBRATING SOME SUPERB A LEVEL AND BTEC RESULTS, BUILDING ON THE SUCCESSES OF PREVIOUS YEARS FOR OUR SIXTH FORM. IN PARTICULAR, THE AVERAGE A LEVEL GRADE ATTAINED BY STUDENTS HAS RISEN SIGNIFICANTLY THIS YEAR.

The vast majority of students secured their first choice at university, with a significant number destined for “redbrick universities”, as a result of achieving the highest grades. These include Veronica Valsechhi who will study Psychology at Liverpool University, Nathan Ferguson and Tom Jones will both study International Business at Liverpool University, and Elissa Griffiths who will study English Language and Linguistics at Lancaster University.

Some other notable successes were Isobel Potts who achieved Distinction, B,C and will study Primary Education at Liverpool John Moores and Holly Sharp, who has secured a place on an Adult

Nursing course, also at LJM. Jemma Harper achieved Distinction*, Distinction, Distinction and will study Business Management at Chester University. Adam Shirt (A, Distinction, Distinction) has deferred his place at De Montfort University for a year. Georgia Gibson (ABB) and Abigail Stewart (BBB) will both study Childhood and Youth Philosophy and Ethics at Liverpool Hope.

Many other students are leaving for their first choice of university. Lots of them are embarking on courses which are the first steps to interesting careers, and reflect the strengths at South Wirral across curriculum areas. Some students have also secured apprenticeships – a good alternative to university – in Law, Childcare and Education.

Simon Goodwin, Headteacher, said:

“We are all proud of the students’ achievements and we wish them every success in the future. These results are the product of many months of hard work and

dedication by the students and support from parents. The results also reflect the excellent planning and teaching of new 2 year A level and BTEC courses by the teaching staff”.

Everybody associated with Sixth Form @ South Wirral is proud of the achievements of all of our students as they now prepare for the next exciting chapter of their lives. Amongst the A*’s and A’s, in many cases, the real success stories are where students have exceeded all expectations through sustained hard work and excellent teaching.
