The Psychology Department

We provide a vibrant and stimulating environment for students to develop interest in the relationship between brain and behaviour, and explore the various methodologies for studying such relationship. The Psychology Department follows the AQA specification which covers topics such as human memory, abnormality, social influence, forensic psychology and schizophrenia. Critically, research methods and data handling techniques used by psychologists are also a core focus.

Students have the opportunity to attend the psychology clinic and society, where tailored discussions take place and research is reviewed in student-led seminar style sessions. Oxbridge enrichment sessions also provide our students with opportunities to develop their psychological knowledge beyond the A Level specification. Development of diagnosis and critical analysis skills are key and we ensure this subject is taught in a way that fosters such insight via applied case studies, data analysis and independent literature review tasks. Psychology book club and film workshop events are also very popular, encouraging students to really expand their theory to practice thinking. Students also have access to key resources such as the British Psychological Society monthly magazine, The Psychologist, and Psychology Review. Some topics (e.g., Cognition and

Development) are excitingly accompanied by lunchtime live research seminars where students get hands-on experience conducting controlled observations and experiments of behaviour.

Psychology is one of the largest A Level departments at Caterham School and many of our students go on to study pure psychology and specific study options (e.g., clinical and forensic psychology) at university (including Oxbridge courses). Studying psychology here at Caterham also serves as a valuable basis for other academic options including Medicine, Neuroscience and Law. Our aim is to equip every student with a stronger awareness of how to describe, predict and evaluate human behaviour, and to understand how such knowledge can be applied in ways that enhance human life.


solvers and innovators, confident in their ability to lead and with a clear appreciation of and respect for the views and potential of others. In so doing we remain true to our founding Christian principles and values.
