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EBC Outstanding Achievements 2017

Academic

- 120 of the 156 Sixth Form leavers have university places. Two thirds of these will study STEM subjects.
- A Level pass rate 95% (64% A*-C) and BTEC National pass rate 100% (70% Distinction or Distinction*).
- 9 boys achieved 8 or more GCSE passes at Grade A*-A.
- Selected GCSE pass rates by subject: Physics 100%, Art 100%, Computing 100%, Biology 98%, DT 95%, PE 100%, Citizenship 94%, RE 100%, Engineering 100%.
- 75% of Year 11 continue their studies at EBC 6th Form.

Co-Curricular

EBC gained STEM Assured Status in June 2016 in recognition of our sustained excellence in STEM subject areas (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths; Computing and Art are also often included) and our commitment to forging ever stronger links with employers and universities in this key sector. We are one of only a small handful of schools in the country to be awarded this accolade.

Combined Cadet Force (Royal Marines) Detachment: Second Sea Lord took the salute at the Grand Opening in April 2017. First new detachment in the area for many years and only 2nd Royal Marines detachment in London.


Duke of Edinburgh: 16 took part in Bronze award, 18 Silver & 2 Gold. Since the scheme was launched at EBC in 2009, over 300 students have participated.

20 Trinity Music Grade passes including 5 students who have earned UCAS points by passing Grade 6 and above.

International School Status; renewed until 2019 in recognition of languages and residential trips abroad including to China (MFL), Switzerland (CERN- Physics), Paris (Disneyland- ICT), Iceland (Geography), France (Ski Trip), Spain (MFL), Greece (Cricket Tour), Spain (Judo training camp).

Sporting Achievements

- Athletics: Year 7 win Wandsworth Indoor Athletics and Year 8 take silver
- Cross Country: National U13 Cross Country Champion and InterCounties Cross Country Championship, represents England & wins Team Gold
- Judo: British Schools Two silver & two Bronze Medallists. One judoka ranked at number one in the country in his weight category and one takes Silver at the English Open Championships
- Year 7 Rugby Team win South London Rugby Union Championship
- National Table Tennis Team Finals: Silver: Under 16s (subsequently selected to represent England in 2018), 4th Place Under 13s. Three players representing Surrey, 2 ranked 35 or above in England
- National Volleyball Winners: Gold: Under 16 Boys National Volleyball Champions, Silver Under 18s & Bronze Under 15s. Silver at London Youth Games representing Wandsworth
- Sixth Form Cricket Academy launched September 2016 - for students to combine studies with cricket coaching and academy matches
