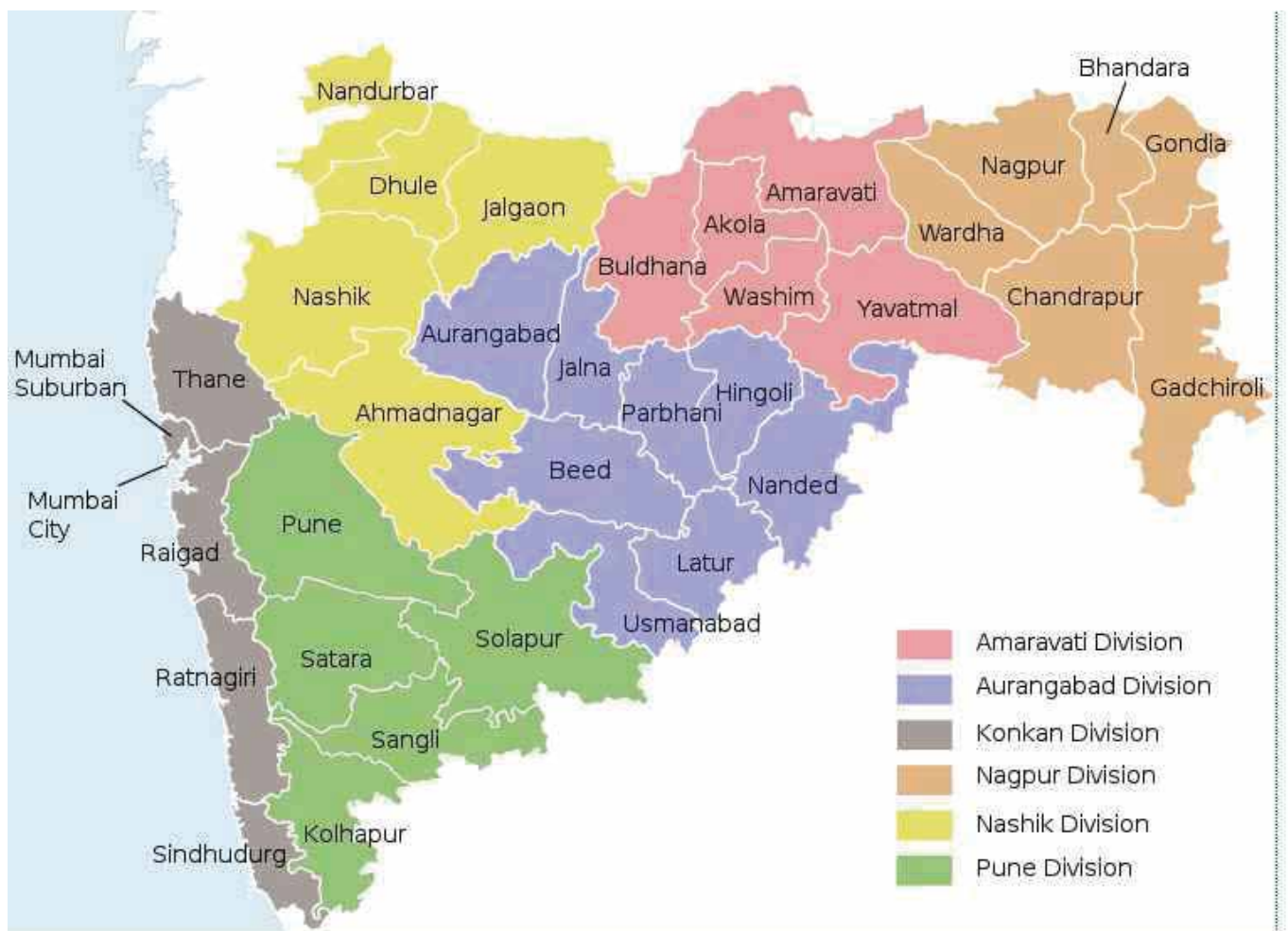

Where we are in Pune

Pune is the second largest city in the state of Maharashtra in western India (population approximately 5 million), around 160 kilometres south-east of the state capital, Mumbai. Situated 560 metres above sea level on the Deccan plateau, at the confluence of the Mula and Mutha river, it is the administrative capital of Pune District and the eighth most populous metropolitan area in India.

Pune is viewed by many to be Maharashtra's cultural capital and the form of Marathi spoken in Pune is considered to be the standard form of the language. The culture of Pune encompasses both the traditional Maharashtrian lifestyle that is prevalent in the heart of the city, as well as a modern, progressive outlook resulting from it being a hub for education and liberal thought. People from multiple religions and speaking different regional languages reside here, and English is widely spoken here. It also hosts various national festivals and cultural events throughout the year

Pune is situated on the leeward side of the Sahyadri mountain range (the Western Ghats), which separate it from the Arabian Sea. It is a relatively hilly city, with its tallest hill, Vetal Hill, rising to 800m (2,625 ft) above sea level. Just outside the city, the Sinhagad fort is located at a height of 1300m.

The climate is tropical with a monsoon season and a usually dry climate with average temperatures ranging between 20°C to 28°C. Pune experiences three distinct seasons: summer, monsoon and winter. Typical summer months are from March to May, with maximum temperatures ranging from 30 to 40 °C.

The warmest month in Pune is April; although summer doesn't end until May, the city often receives locally developed heavy thundershowers in May (although humidity remains high). Even during the hottest months, the nights are usually cooler due to Pune's altitude.

The monsoon lasts from June to October, with moderate rainfall and falls ranging from 10°C to 28°C (50°F to 82°F). Most of the 722mm of rainfall in the city fall between June and September, and July is the wettest month of the year. Pune once received rainfall on 29 consecutive days.

Winter begins in November; November in particular is known as the Rosy Cold (Marathi). The daytime temperature hovers around 28 °C (83 °F) while night temperature is below 10 °C (50 °F) for most of December and January, often dropping to 5 or 6 °C (42 °F). The lowest temperature ever located was 1.7 °C on January 17, 1935.

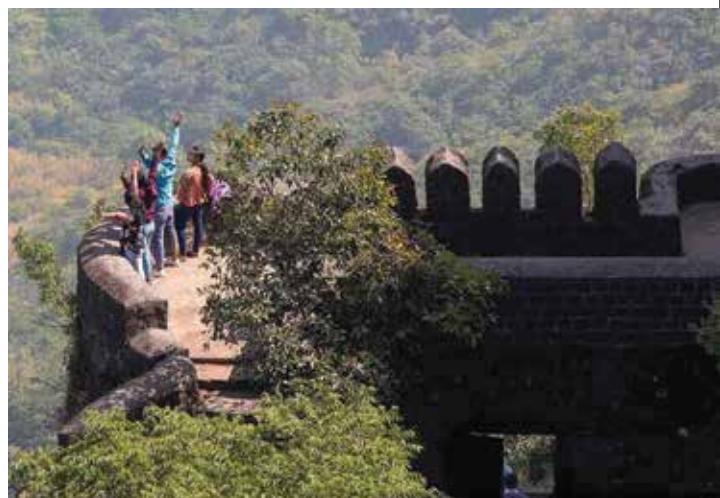


Places to Visit in and around Pune

Sinhgad Fort

Sinhgad Fort lies at a distance of 25km from Pune city. It is one of the popular picnic spots near the city. It is located on a hill, at a height 700 m above the surrounding landscape. Due to its height, the fort also serves as a popular trekking destination for the people of Pune.

Sinhgad can be accessed by the S.T. and P.C.M.T buses. A well-marked path - partly in steps - takes one to the top, through a series of gates. An alternative route is also up the ridge through the forests and leading right up to the fort.





Lavasa

Is a private planned city near Pune. It is stylistically based on the Italian town Portofino. Lavasa is famous for its sheer natural beauty. Adlabs Imagica

Khandala

Khandala and Lonavala are neighbours. Although it is comparatively small, it is equally blessed with natural beauty. A deep valley on one side and high hills on the other side divide Khandala and Lonavala. While travelling on the Mumbai Bangalore National Highway, one has to cross the arduous Khopoli - Khandala Ghat. This is the famous Borghat. In a short distance of 8 kms one has to climb a height of 369 metres. This is a difficult Ghat to climb. But once you reach here, you feel that this climb has been worth the trouble. It is located about 120km (75 mi) southwest of Pune and 285km (177 mi) from Mumbai.



Mahabaleshwar

Mahabaleshwar is a vast plateau measuring 150km² (58 sq miles), bounded by valleys on all sides. Mahabaleshwar is a popular holiday resort. Mahabaleshwar is also known for the honey and strawberries produced here. One can visit strawberry farms to enjoy the real flavour of the fruit. It is said that the climate of Mahabaleshwar is ideal for strawberries and mulberries.

The Venna Lake is one of the major tourist attractions of Mahabaleshwar. The lake is surrounded by trees on all sides. A late winter evening boat ride through the slight fog is well appreciated.





Matheran

The British Raj discovered Matheran & developed it as a famous tourist destination. Motor vehicles are banned and many visitors arrive by the narrow-gauge railway on the 1907 Neral-Matheran Toy Train. The train takes you through dense forest. The real beauty of Matheran is best viewed in the monsoon. The climate is cool and pleasant with a beautiful lake and many points worth a visit. It is nearest hill station to Bombay. The distance from Pune & Matheran is 120.5kms and can be reached in 2.5hrs. www.newmatheran.com



Rajmachi Park

Staying Healthy and Safety Tips

- ✧ Avoid drinking tap water
- ✧ Homes equipped with a water purifier should be serviced on an annual basis
- ✧ Fruits & vegetables should be carefully washed before eating. There are veggie wash producers which help cut residues or bacteria. It is also effective to use a bit of dish soap and/or salt in the washing water.
- ✧ It is normal to have some 'traveller's diarrhoea' when moving to India. This is your body adjusting to new foods, spices and bacteria. If you do not have a fever, the normal treatment is to drink plenty of fluids with rehydration salts. Eat plain foods like banana, plain bread or rice. Plain curd or yogurt is also helpful.

Price of Things

Availability & Sample prices

Most vegetables are Rs. 50-80/kilogram; more for “exotic” vegetables like red & yellow pepper, broccoli, asparagus, mushrooms, etc., but they can all be found!!!

Chicken/fish/lamb/goat, etc: Rs. 140-400/kilogram (meats are cheaper but less hygienic in the outdoor markets than in the fancier supermarkets).

Other food

Besides using Amazon, Flipkart or other online retailers who deliver in Pune, you can find virtually anything, including a large range of imported food items like olive oil, balsamic vinegar, canned meats of various

kinds, different kinds of pasta, cheese, cocoa in upscale shops in Pune. Coke, Pepsi, and other fizzy drinks are widely available (even in tiny village shops!).

Alcohol

Beer—India has some fantastic beer—Kingfisher and Bira being some favourites. Imported brands are also available like Fosters, Heineken, San Miguel, Castle, etc. Pune has a bunch of Beer gardens and microbreweries, so do explore those. Wine—Some interesting Indian brands, both reds & whites; the quality of Indian wines is markedly improving, but they are expensive. Wines usually cost Rs. 400-900 per bottle, with a decent wine being around Rs. 600.

Spirits

Domestically produced rum, gin, vodka, whisky, etc. are about Rs. 800-1500 per bottle (approx. 750ml.-1 litre volume). “Indian made foreign liquor” as it’s known, is great! However, do not buy from very small, dubious-looking liquor stores; ask once you get here for recommended stores.



Checklist

Packing List

There is nothing you cannot find in Pune, but in case you're bringing stuff anyway, you might want to throw some of these in the mix! These are just some ideas... Even though you can find almost everything in Pune, basically, bring some things from home (Home brands) that you are used to using, since imported goods may be a bit pricey here!

Kitchen

- ✚ Particular spices or dry goods from home
- ✚ Liquor (Mumbai International Airport Duty Free is great). Pune has a bunch of micro-breweries as well :)
- ✚ Dark chocolate (some say the dark chocolate in India is sweeter, but you can buy imported chocolate easily)
- ✚ If you have particular dietary requirements (i.e., gluten free, vegan) you might want to stock up on some items.

Clothing

- ✚ Rain boots and raincoat (since you will arrive at the peak of monsoon!)
- ✚ Warm clothes for winter months (yes, it does get a little chilly on campus)
- ✚ Any trekking gear if planning a trek to the Himalayas (including warm coat and boots). However, there is a decathlon store in Pune where you can find outdoor gear.
- ✚ Full piece swimsuit (No bikinis allowed during session time)
- ✚ A sturdy pair of sandals
- ✚ A light daypack for day hikes.
