Information for candidates

Job Description

The Governors of this popular and over subscribed school are seeking to appoint a well-qualified, high calibre, enthusiastic teacher of Physical Education who is able to teach PE up to GCSE and possibly 'A' Level and Science up to KS4 for September 2017.

We are looking for an outstanding teacher or a teacher who has the potential to be outstanding and has a relevant degree and QTS.

We want someone who loves teaching, who wants to be outstanding, and has a willingness to approach his/her teaching in a creative and enthusiastic manner. We aim to stimulate a both physical education and scientific curiosity in all of our students. Through an engaging curriculum we are looking to continue raising achievement. You would be working in two highly cohesive departments where outstanding standards and innovative classroom practice are commonplace. With this in mind we are looking for someone who can make a real difference to the lives of our students.

Organisation:

PE - Key Stage 3 (Year 7 – 8)

In Years 7 to 9 pupils are taught in 3 groups (boys, girls and mixed gender), rotating around 2/3 activities per term, with 2 x 1 hour lessons per week. The Curriculum across the Key Stage is organised to allow access for pupils to experience individual activities, such as orienteering, gymnastic, trampolining and athletics, invasion games, such as football and hockey, divided court activities, such as badminton and tennis and striking and fielding activities such as rounders and cricket. Students are assessed via 3 strands, incorporating practical performance; knowledge of health, fitness & team work and finally evaluative skills, the latter being taught through a classroom lesson once every half term.

Key Stage 4 (Year 9 – 11)Key stage 4 begins in Year 9 where students have the option to study 3 additional lessons of GCSE (AQA and OCR specifications) or BTEC (Pearsons') PE a week. In Year 10 and 11 this reduces to 2 hours per week. The practical elements of the courses are continually assessed, with the theory element being taken as an external exam at the end of Year 11 (GCSE) and Year 10 (BTEC).


Key Stage 5 (Year 12 - 13)

At A level, the department follows OCR Physical Education. There is also the opportunity for students to take BTEC Level 3 Sport.

The uptake for GCSE, BTEC and A Level courses are consistently high.

Extra-curricular

We run an extensive extra-curricular programme to encompass both participation and performance. The department boast a range of successful netball, football, handball, badminton, rounders', athletics, trampolining, rugby and basketball teams, to name a few. There are also residential trips for students Years 7-9 to Lockerbrook, Hagg Farm and the Dordogne.











Key Stage 3 At KS3, students are taught in setted classes. In Year 7 and Year 8, students have three lessons of Science per week. The KS3 course takes account of National Curriculum changes and uses a wide variety of Teaching and Learning techniques. Schemes of work, lesson plans and resources have been developed by the department and are all saved and accessed centrally on the school computer network.

Key Stage 4

Key Stage 4 begins in Year 9 where students have 3 lessons of science a week and study AQA courses in GCSE Biology, GCSE Chemistry, GCSE Physics and AQA Trilogy Science. Increasingly more of our students are studying triple science. In Years 10 and 11 students have 5 lessons of science a week. External examinations takes place at the end of Year 11.

Opportunities

The successful candidate will have full involvement in All Saints' comprehensive CPD programme. They will also be part of two vibrant departments working with enthusiastic subject specialists. The successful candidate will be able to develop professionally as they teach exam classes, and within departments that highly value the sharing of good practice and continually strive to provide robust and meaningful to ensure that all pupils are supported to achieve their full potential. This role is suitable for NQTs or experienced staff.
