Living In Seoul

Seoul is one of East Asia's biggest and most exciting cities; it is ranked as the 4th largest city in the World. Bustling and vibrant, it is characterised by a mixture of the old and the new. Its towering skyscrapers and multi-lane highways surround historic palaces and temples, and huge modern shopping complexes compete for trade with street hawkers selling traditional snacks from the back of push-carts.

At night the city comes alive, bursting with late night shoppers looking for bargains at the many night-markets, post-work diners fill karaoke bars and restaurants, and the city is illuminated by a sea of neon and gigantic TV screens.

Seoul's population is almost 10.5 million accounting for 21 per cent of the country's total population (the figures rise to 22 million, or 46% of the total population, if you include greater Seoul). This means there is little space, so be prepared for crowds - imagine London at rush hour, the only difference is that in Seoul rush hour can happen at any time!

Eight mountain peaks surround Seoul and just north of the city is Bukhansan National Park, a forested mountain park of granite peaks and cliffs with numerous Buddhist temples and fantastic views. The city centre itself is dominated by the mountain of Namsan, which provides natural relief from the cars and concrete of the city, with its parks, walking trails and indoor botanical garden. Its peak tower is also a useful navigation tool. The Han River bisects the city separating the older downtown city to the north from the trendier newer southern districts. In the warmer months its banks host a number of recreational activities including a cycling and running track, in-line skating facilities, archery, kite-flying, fishing, water-skiing and even a sailing club.

The city has an excellent public transport network including the clean, cheap and reliable subway. Most journeys within the city cost around 60p (\$0.9) and longer journeys of up to 45-minutes to suburban Seoul around £1 (\$1.5). Taxis are plentiful and very cheap; a 15-minute journey usually costs around KRW6, 000 (about £3 (\$4.5)). A good way to see the country is by taking the "KTX", Korea's high-speed train network that runs regular routes from Seoul to Busan and other cities. The journey from Seoul to the port town of Busan on the South East Coast takes under 3hrs. Tickets cost about £30 (\$45) each way and can easily be booked online via the English language website.
