St. Gilgen International School is a co-educational boarding and day school for students aged 9 to 18. The school was founded in 2008, and since then has grown steadily. The founder of St. Gilgen International School envisaged a unique school with members drawn from the local and international community sharing a high quality academic and personal education in beautiful surroundings.

On the 17th of May 2016, ownership of the school passed to a foundation of parents of the school community (Privatstiftung). This foundation acts solely in the interests of the school and school community. It undertakes to secure the school's future. As such, all profits are reinvested back into the school. The new ownership harnesses our community spirit and drives us to work together in a continued effort to improve our already exceptional school.

Music Department Information

Our very active Music Department is currently situated in a beautiful building above the Ratz boarding house, right at the edge of the Wolfgangsee. The facilities comprise two well equipped teaching rooms, a dedicated Piano room and a drum/practice room. Music Technology is a feature of the department and we have professional editing software. A broad variety of acoustic instruments and keyboards are available to all students for use in lessons and extra-curricular activities.

Music is taught as a curriculum subject from Grade 4 to Grade 10. The IB Diploma is offered to students in Grades 11 and 12 at both Standard and Higher Level. Teaching periods are 50 minutes in duration and the period allocation for lessons ranges from two periods per week for Grades 4 -6, one period for Grades 7-9 and three periods in Grade 10. The curriculum for Music embraces a wide range of topics including Western Classical, Popular Culture, Jazz and World Music, Composition, Film Music and Music Theory. In Grade 10 the students follow a modified curriculum drawing from a range of international programmes (including iGCSE) in preparation for the IB Diploma in Grades 11 and 12.

We have a developing Orchestra and a Junior and Senior Choir who rehearse during Activity time, after school. These activities are used to prepare for our Annual concerts such as the Winter and Summer Concerts, Musicals and various Recitals mostly held in the beautiful Mozarthaus, throughout the year, amongst other annual school celebrations, such as Prize Giving.

The department of Music currently consists of one full time teacher and a number of visiting instrumental specialists who deliver individual lessons during the week to our students. The instrumental side has grown enormously in the past three years which has resulted in the development of the Orchestra and students taking Music at Higher Level for the IB Diploma.

The Music Department is a place where students can be creative and happy, whilst developing their musical aspirations and talents in a friendly, relaxing environment.

The Arts @StGIS

Within the wider Arts department, in addition to Music the students can study Theatre (Drama) and Visual Arts (Art). These subjects are taught throughout the school as part of the 'arts' offering at StGIS. Visual Arts is taught in the atmospheric 'Art Garage' and Theatre is taught in the 'kino', originally the village cinema, which has been renovated, and now acts as a 180 seat theatre and assembly hall. There is one specialist in each Arts faculty.

Music Teacher: Overview of role

1. Teach Music to groups of students across the age range, including up to IB Diploma level, as determined by the curriculum needs of the school (up to 21, 50-minute periods out of 33 per week).
2. As required, act as an IB Diploma Extended Essay supervisor for Music .
3. With agreement, to teach an additional subject as required and appropriate.
4. Work collaboratively with colleagues to plan and prepare conceptually driven units of study in-line with departmental and whole school curriculum aims and objectives, and design and implement effective and coherent learning activities, using a range of teaching methodologies and approaches.
5. Plan appropriate opportunities for students to demonstrate what they know, understand and can do and provide regular formative feedback to support learning, including through constructive self- and peer- assessment, and maintain accurate records (in-line with the school's Assessment and Reporting Policy).
6. Incorporate relevant out-of-class learning into the curriculum whenever possible.
7. Report on student progress to parents as required by the whole-school Assessment and Reporting Policy.
8. Ensure that the health and safety requirements of the Music department, and whole school, are adhered to secure a safe working environment for staff and students.
9. Promptly pass information to Mentor Tutors, House Parents and other relevant staff (and parents) when a student's effort or achievement is praiseworthy or giving cause for concern.
10. In addition, the following areas of responsibility will also fall within the remit of the Teacher of Music:
 - i. Source and coordinate the peripatetic music teachers and the weekly lesson schedules.
 - ii. Coordinate the Winter and Summer Concerts, Annual Inter house Sing, Prize Giving performances and a variety of concerts and recitals throughout the year.
 - iii. Maintain communications with both the Mozarthaus in St. Gilgen and the Mozarteum in Salzburg
 - iv. Oversee external examinations and entries, and examination requirements for the Associated Board of Music or similar
 - v. Have the ability to conduct a choir and / or Orchestra, preferably both.
 - vi. Must have experience in Music technology using programmes such as pro tool and Sibelius
11. Contribute to whole-school duties as necessary, and provide cover for absent colleagues when asked to do so.
12. Act as a Mentor Tutor for a small group of students, have oversight of the students academic and pastoral needs, provide necessary guidance, and liaise with relevant parties as appropriate.
13. Play a full role in the wider learning opportunities and care required of a 7-day a week boarding school, including co-curricular activities, and support in Boarding houses; this will entail weekend commitments
14. Any other reasonable duties at a level commensurate with the post, as directed by the Subject Leader and/or Senior Leadership.

Head of Department

In addition, as **Head of Arts** - covering Music, Theatre (Drama) and Visual Arts (Art) - the following additional broad areas of responsibility would also apply (the HoD role comes with a 25% time remission):

- Maintain an overview of the Arts curriculum; to ensure that it remains up-to-date, relevant and effectively implemented.
- Have oversight of health and safety, and risk assessment aspects within the Art department.
- Manage, professionally guide, and mentor other members of the Arts department (including Teachers and any support staff)
- Ensure the Arts budget is controlled and managed within planned and agreed expenditure parameters.
- Contribute to whole school 'middle' management processes, including attendance at weekly "Learning Forum' meetings (between HoDs and other relevant staff) and involvement in other strategic projects as appropriate.
- Promote and encourage the development of Arts beyond the formal curriculum, including contributing significantly to key annual Arts events such as the Winter Concert, drama productions, and art shows.

Music Teacher: Person Specification

Essential

- A relevant Bachelor's degree, and excellent subject knowledge and passion.
- A recognized teaching qualification / qualified teacher status.
- At least 2-years of teaching experience.
- Creativity and professional rigour, and the willingness to be actively involved in curriculum development.
- A 'risk-taker' with a growth mindset; somebody who is able to accept that making mistakes is fundamental to learning.
- Enthusiasm to be a part of the school's diverse co-curricular program.
- Willingness to contribute to the evening and weekend care needs of a 24/7 boarding school.
- Very high levels of personal organization; ability to coordinate a wide variety of operational items.
- A sense of humour; and the ability to balance the demands of HIGH STANDARDS with a low stress approach.
- A collaborative 'team player' who understands that we must work together on our 'path of excellence'.

Desirable

- Experience in (or willingness to acquire), Music technology including programmes such as pro-tool and Sibelius
- Relevant Head of Department or similar 'middle leader' experience (if showing an interest in the Head of Department possibility).
- A postgraduate degree (preferably in the field of Education).
- Ability and willingness to teach an additional (second) subject and/or contribute to our English support program.
- IB Diploma experience and alignment with the IB mission.
- Experience of teaching or supporting the IB Diploma Theory of Knowledge or Extended Essay.
- Experience working with students from different language and educational backgrounds (particularly international school experience).
- Previous experience working in a boarding school (or similar residential) environment.
- Current, clean drivers license valid for use in Austria.

Application Process

The appointment is for August 2018 and the initial contract will be for a period of two years (renewable by mutual consent). The salary will be in the range € 39,923 to € 55,682 depending on qualifications and experience; plus, if applicable a HoD allowance of € 3,150. An additional allowance of € 2,101 is paid for a higher degree e.g. MA, MEd, MBA, EdD, PhD.

Please ensure your letter directly addresses the job description, and the essential and desirable characteristics detailed above, as well as any other aspects you consider important.
3. A full Curriculum Vitae including complete employment history (x2 sides of A4 excluding references)
4. Details of three referees including postal address, email address and telephone number (please ensure they know they may be contacted and will respond promptly). Note that we reserve the right to contact any of your previous employers.

The closing date for applications is Friday 9th March. All applications will be acknowledged, and those being called for interview will be contacted with more details. **Early applications are encouraged, and we reserve the right to appoint before the closing date if an exceptional candidate is found.** Long-list first round interviews will take place via Skype with the relevant Head of Department and the Deputy Head (Academic).

Short-list / second round interviews will either take place at StGIS in Austria or (if this is not possible) will be conducted via Skype; this round will include a final formal interview with the Head of School.

Following the interview process, we aim to make a decision quickly and inform all short-listed candidates of the outcome as soon as possible. A 'verbal' agreement will be expected at this stage, to be followed by contractual arrangements. Any offer of employment is subject to our safe recruitment practice which includes:

1. Receipt of satisfactory references
2. Identity verification
3. Satisfactory police check
4. Confirmation of qualifications

By agreement and as applicable, all reasonable expenses for interview travel and accommodation will be covered by the school upon presentation of receipts.
