About our school

St Andrew's is a Church of England School with strong links to St Andrew's Parish Church in Chase Side.

The origins of St Andrew's School can be traced back to 1810 when the Walker family founded a school at the junction of Powys Lane and Wilmer Way 'to teach ... reading, writing and arithmetic'. In 1885 the school moved to its present site, at a cost of £1,633.

Today St Andrew's combines strong educational focus with an emphasis on encouraging each child to develop his or her individual talents.



Aims of the school

The broad aims of St Andrew's School align with those of a Church of England Primary School and they underpin the organization and implementation of the curriculum. They are as follows:

- to provide a caring, Christian atmosphere and environment in which the children's learning may be enjoyable, purposeful and instructive;
- to foster and further strengthen the relationships between the home, the school and the Church;
- to provide equal opportunities for all pupils and encourage their social, emotional, spiritual and intellectual development;
- to prepare the children for their future role in society by encouraging them to build on their natural curiosity and to develop lively, enquiring minds, to question and argue rationally, to look for connections and apply previous knowledge and to assess their own performance critically;
- to help the children to develop moral values, spirituality and a firm understanding of and deep respect for people of all races, religions and cultures;
- to guide the children to use language and mathematical understanding effectively, to appreciate artistic and aesthetic values and to develop their physical skills.

School Ethos

The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils. We place emphasis on six values that we use to guide our behaviours and attitudes.

Stewardship, compassion, peace, service, thankfulness and justice.

It is with the aims and ethos statement in mind that we plan activities within the school. We strive to create an environment where children are inspired to learn.

We have recently achieved Outstanding in our SIAMS review which reflects our commitment to our Christian values and has been achieved through:

- strong links with St Andrew's Church with weekly collective worship from Fr Edd Turner;
- Supporting spiritual guidance and growth for children through our creative RE curriculum;
- Involvement with the church through whole school performances and services at St Andrews;
- Commitment to our school values and how they are lived and embedded in our school life;
- A clearly articulated, nurturing ethos shared throughout the entire school community.

Curriculum

St Andrew's is a multi-cultural school. We have pupils from a wide variety of backgrounds. This diversity prepares our pupils to live in today's Britain and is reflected in our rich and creative curriculum.

The subjects taught in this school include those laid down in the new National Curriculum, i.e. RE, English, Mathematics, Science, Design and Technology, Computing, History, Geography, Music, Art, PE and Modern Foreign Languages at KS2.

Over recent years we have increasingly focused on creativity within the curriculum. We follow a topic-based approach involving practical tasks and, where appropriate, outdoor activities to support the children's learning and deepen their understanding and enjoyment. The topics, which change termly, are varied and are usually Science, History or Geography based. Teachers are actively encouraged to bring these subjects to life through their classroom teaching, homework and educational visits and visitors.

There is a strong focus on how teachers are supported to develop their teaching. This is promoted by phase leaders who work with year group teams to support, encourage and challenge teachers when planning and delivering the curriculum. This collaborative approach has improved the standards of teaching and has provided effective learning and development for teachers.

Teachers are offered regular professional development opportunities through INSET and attendance at training provided by the Local Authority and Diocese.





The school's exciting curriculum is broad and balanced and pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development is promoted effectively.

Parent/Carers

St Andrews is supported by a committed community of parents and carers. There is a strong PTA which helps to enrich the children's school experience by providing additional teaching and learning resources and through organising events that support the development of friendships and networks.

Culture

St Andrew's puts learning at the heart of the school and promotes a culture of continuous improvement. The focus is on academic excellence but also on the holistic development of each child.

Our school has a strong commitment to clubs and societies and provides a huge range of opportunities for children such as:

- Sporting clubs such as gymnastics, football, table tennis;

- External opportunities such as the Enfield Dance Festival, Young Voices children's Choir and 'Big Bang' science competitions.

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is a critical part of the school's culture. Staff and Governors are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare, safety, positive mental health and inclusion of all pupils.
