Cleveden Secondary School: School Profile

Cleveden Secondary is a six-year comprehensive non-denominational, co-educational school situated in the Kelvindale area of the north west of Glasgow. The school aims to provide, in a caring, safe and orderly environment, a high-quality education which will meet the academic, social and moral needs, and promote the effective personal development, of all our pupils. It seeks to achieve this in partnership with parents and with the whole community. Cleveden parents have always been strongly supportive of the school, and have valued its commitment to promoting our values of Happiness, Respect, Honesty and Equality.

The current roll is just under 600 with approximately 47 teaching staff. The school has six associated primaries spread across a large geographical area and serving some very diverse and contrasting communities. Cleveden children represent families with origins in more than twenty different countries. Our young people come from very mixed backgrounds, some parents are working, but many more are single parents living on the edge of poverty, and approximately 30% of the pupils receive clothing grants or free meals. We have an integration centre "Campsie Suite" with 16 children who are taught within it and in mainstream classes.

Staff-pupil relationships have always been good, and are most often characterised by genuine warmth as well as by mutual respect. Visitors to the school often remark on the relaxed atmosphere and on the absence of signs of vandalism or graffiti. Cleveden has always had a very rich provision of extra-curricular activities.

There is a very active Parent Council and a fund-raising Group who provide support to the school. The school keeps in touch with parents and the community through regular parents' evenings and newsletters.

The Senior Leadership Team currently consists of the HT and 3 Depute Head Teachers. We have the support of an Area Finance Assistant from the Area Support Team. There are also 9 Principal Teachers of Subject/Faculty and 4 Principal Teachers of Pupil Support. Support staff consists of a clerical/admin team, Support For Learning Workers, a team of Technicians, an Education Liaison Officer, a part-time Librarian, janitorial, cleaning and catering personnel.
