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Caledonia Primary School: School Profile

Caledonia Primary and LCR is located in the Baillieston area of Glasgow. It consists of a mainstream school and a Language and Communication Resource which has a capacity of 24. Caledonia Primary was built in the 1970's and has a present role of approximately 230 pupils which is currently arranged into 9 classes. It has a large playground, gym hall and art room. The Glasgow PEPASS team is also housed within the building.

The LCR consists of 4 class teaching areas and a playroom however it also has access to all parts of the mainstream.

The school is recognised as being Communication Friendly and has been recognised in the past for its work in Gaelic and Outdoor Learning.

The Staff

There is a staffing complement of 11.9 in the mainstream. This includes the Head Teacher, an Acting Depute Head, 2 Principal teachers in the mainstream and 1 in the LCR. There is a specialist PE teacher who works on a Monday and a Tuesday. The Head Teacher has overall responsibility for both the mainstream and the LCR and the Depute Head manages the day to day running of it. There is a teaching entitlement of 5.0 in the LCR. This is made up of four teachers and the Principal Teacher. The children join with mainstream classes for P.E and also other points in the week based on the needs of the children. In the mainstream there are 4 Support for Learning Workers and 4 in the LCR. The support staff also consists of two clerical assistants. There is also a Janitor, Catering and Cleaning staff.

Partnership

There is a very supportive and Active Parent Council who help organise activities throughout the year. There are a number of opportunities for parents to assist and become involved in the learning and education of their children. Partnership between the home and the school is regarded as an important part of the education of our children.

Links with the local nurseries, primaries and Bannerman High School, are very good.

Caledonia Primary School offers a wide range of After School Activities most days and we strive to enrich our children by regularly visiting the environment beyond the school. Learning in and out of school is a key element of our programmes of study. We always participate in sporting activities, events and competitions, often with success! There is a walking bus before school which is organised by the Support for Learning Workers. They also run an after school homework club.
