Taylor's International School Kuala Lumpur is part of Taylor's Education Group, Malaysia's premier private education group which includes Garden International School, Nexus International School Putrajaya, the Australian International School in Malaysia, Nexus International School Singapore, and our sister school, Taylor's International School in Puchong, as well as institutions of higher education at Taylor's Colleges and Taylor's University.

The School

Taylor's International School Kuala Lumpur is centrally located just to the East of Kuala Lumpur city centre, five minutes from the famous Petronas Twin Towers, and can easily be found on Google maps. Our campus is located very close to the CBD, and the main shopping malls of KL city centre. The school has transformed from a Malaysian curriculum school with a rich 28 year history into now its tenth year as an International Curriculum School.

Taylor's International School offers a holistic education from Early Years to IGCSE, and follows the National Curriculum of England adapted for Malaysia. At KS4, the school follows IGCSE courses from CIE. All students study Bahasa Malaysia and Mandarin

Currently there are 1750 students (from over 36 different nationalities) in the school from early years through to year 11. Approximately 18% of teachers in the school are expatriates; with the remainder of the teachers Malaysian. The school encourages all its teachers to use current ideas in teaching and learning and to support this; all classrooms are equipped with interactive whiteboards and teachers have MacBooks. The school heavily uses the Google suite for education with students and for admin.

Our purpose statement is to "educate the youth of the world to take their productive place as leaders in the global community", which encapsulates our holistic approach to education.

Our curriculum is so much more than just academic lessons and as an International Curriculum School, we also place emphasis on academic excellence, character building and physical health and development.

The school is very active outside of lessons, with many opportunities in sport, debate and public speaking; Model United Nations, Interact and charity work, Music and performance, to mention a few.

The school places a large emphasis on staff development and training. There are weekly CPD sessions, to help all teachers increase the impact that they have in the classroom. Taylor's International Schools are extensive users of the Quantum Learning System for teaching from the United States (www.quantumlearning.com) and are in the process of accreditation from them. Expatriate teachers are expected to be role models for our child centred, learning focused approach, and as such will be expected to coach and mentor Malaysian colleagues.
