A message from the Headteacher

Thank you for your interest in Cardinal Newman Catholic High School. We are a vibrant, ambitious and caring community, with students drawn from a variety of backgrounds. Everything that happens within our school is inspired by gospel values and Cardinal Newman's words that we are all 'a link in a chain. A bond of connection between persons.'

We are a good, oversubscribed school (Ofsted 2016)

located in Latchford, Warrington with a large catchment area extending across the South of Warrington from which we draw our 800 pupils.

Our academic results are testament to the success of our students:

- 52% of our students achieved at least a Grade 5 in English and Maths, whilst 73% achieved a grade 4 in these subjects
- 57% of our students were entered for the EBACC, well above the national average and demonstrating our commitment to a broad and balanced curriculum
- 24% Grades 9-7 demonstrate our students attain at the very highest level across a range of subjects

Success at Cardinal Newman takes many forms. The extra curricular life of our school is flourishing, with a wide variety of active sports clubs. We have particular success in Rugby League and Rowing for both our male and female teams, but our sporting offer is wide ranging and growing. Our Performing Arts are a key component of the enrichment on offer with a variety of musical ensembles, a highly successful school show and both Drama and Music thriving at GCSE. Our programme of school visits, including our RE trip to New York and Geography trip to Iceland ensure our students have a growing understanding of the wider world, and their role within it as active citizens. Our cutting edge provision in mental health and our outstanding pastoral team ensure that our students also have the emotional skills they need to succeed throughout their lives.

Our staff team are also committed to lifelong learning and continuing professional development. Our CPD offer is comprehensive, combining in- house coaching and development programmes alongside excellent provision from our partner TSAs and our Diocese. These programmes ensure that staff can access exciting opportunities and continue to develop as professionals throughout their time with us, to the benefit of their own learning as well as the experience of our students.

About the Department

The English Department is a successful and forward thinking department characterised by a strong sense of collaboration and enthusiasm for our subject and our students. The English department strives to foster within students a love of language and literature. We aim to develop students' ability to communicate effectively in a wide range of contexts; to use accurate Standard English and to develop an interest in the richness of the English language in its various forms.

Currently, we are a department of eight English specialists with a strong English leadership team comprised of a Head of Department, an Assistant Head Teacher and SLE, as well as Key Stage Three and Key Stage Four Coordinators. Recognised as an 'outstanding' department by Ofsted (2016) we strive to deliver an engaging and varied curriculum which allows all students to make progress.

The department currently follows the AQA specification for both English Language and Literature and despite significant curriculum changes over the last three years, our progress 8 score for 2018 is +0.24. 79% of our students achieve grade 9-4 in English Language and 66% achieve grade 9-5. In English Literature 73% of our students achieved a grade 9-4 and 54% achieved grade 9-5.

The Faculty's extra-curricular activities reinforce its aspirations: reading is at the forefront of everything we do as we continually embrace opportunities to encourage students to read for pleasure. Visits from writers, speakers and performers, along with regular trips to the theatre, trips to Imperial War Museum and a residential to London in the summer term are available to our students and we engage our students in a variety of enrichment events.

We look forward to welcoming a new member to our dedicated team.
