I'd like to welcome you to Westfield Academy. An amazing school where I'm extremely proud to be the Headteacher.

We are an amazing school and a fabulous alternative to the local Grammar Schools and we understand, profoundly, the need to get the right students onto the right courses and of offering students high quality advice, support and guidance throughout their time with us.

Our last two Ofsted inspections have judged us as Good (2012 and 2016). In particular, in 2016 they highlighted that the "school had improved in many areas since the predecessor school was last inspected." This is extremely gratifying for both the students and the local community as it demonstrates what we believe which is that we are always developing and moving forward. For me as Headteacher it was particularly pleasing that inspectors identified that my team have "raised the school's expectations of pupils' behaviour" and that pupils "behave well in lessons and around school."

YOUR FUTURE AT WESTFIELD ACADEMY

Moving from primary to secondary school is a big move and we do everything we can to ensure this move is as seamless and anxiety free as possible.

We aim to get to know our new students as quickly as possible; students past experiences and knowledge are taken into account when we are planning their learning. We work closely with the primary schools and visit every local school to ensure that we have all the information necessary to help children make that transition.

The transition process is very important and its aim is to make sure academic and pastoral arrangements are made in a way which ensures progression.

We continue to develop stronger links with primary schools in and around Watford. Pupils across Key Stage 2 regularly visit us to experience hands-on lessons in a wide range of subjects. Our specialist teachers also visit primary schools to teach - starting the process of getting to know our new children as early as possible.

All new students are invited to attend a three-day 'Summer School' where they meet their tutors, get a feel for the school and meet their new friends. CURRICULUM

A curriculum to inspire success

We pride ourselves on offering a rich, varied and aspirational curriculum for all our students. We don't believe that one size fits all. We believe that our curriculum should develop to meet the needs of the young people we teach. We believe that young people achieve their best in a learning environment in which they feel engaged, valued and respected.

All students at Key Stage 3 follow a broad and balanced curriculum which includes all the National Curriculum subjects, with all students studying English, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, History, Geography, a Modern Foreign Language, ICT, Sport and Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Education.

As students move into Year 9 the range of subjects expands so that our students can choose from a wide range of options, including a full range of traditional GCSEs, BTEC and other vocational courses.

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD

Good learning happens when students feel secure and enjoy school life.

We have high aspirations for every student and put in place the necessary support to help each child achieve.

We provide high levels of pastoral support and work hard to instil the values – **believe** | **strive** | **achieve** into all our students.

We do not tolerate bullying and our students know who to talk to if they have any concerns. High achieving students are mentored to ensure their needs are being met in mainstream lessons and through a range of enrichment and extension opportunities.

Support for students with special educational needs (SEN), whether these are academic, social, emotional or physical disabilities, is met in a variety of ways: through class support, negotiated withdrawal to work with literacy or learning support assistants and through small group working.

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ENRICHMENT

At Westfield Academy we pride ourselves on offering a broad and rich range of extra-curricular activities to complement and enrich the regular school day.

Life beyond the classroom is incredibly important and allows young people to develop crucial skills and attributes such as confidence, independence and resilience.

We have many extra-curricular clubs and teams including football, cross country, rugby, netball and basketball.

Those keen to be outside and explore can take part in the Duke of Edinburgh Award programme. There's lots of other clubs including Latin, Chess, Drama, Music, Spanish, French and Dance Club.

SPORTS FACILITIES
