

FOREWORD BY THE PRINCIPAL

Whether you are joining Sri KDU® International School for the first time or you are returning for another year, I extend a warm welcome and wish everyone a rewarding and successful academic year 2019-2020. Congratulations to all teachers who were part of the team in the last academic year and who have contributed to another extremely successful year in terms of student achievement. In IGCSE, 62% of A*/A grades were achieved as well as 62% Distinctions in the International Certificate of Education (ICE) with 98% at Merit or above and a 100% pass rate. The IBDP students also did very well and our average point score of 36 was much higher than the world average. We were delighted to have such high-performing IBDP students in 2019, with Max Han scoring a perfect 45 points! Students in the primary school and at KS3 also made excellent progress. There were many individual successes, not just among the high flyers but for students who achieved even more than they thought possible or their CATS data suggested because of the dedication and skill of the teachers.

Another measure of success for our school is that we retain students, year on year, despite the opening of many other international schools; there is such demand for places, especially in our Primary School, that we have expanded SKIPS again for this academic year. Most year groups are full with children on the waiting list. Our primary school, SKIPS, is much smaller than the secondary but is a very important and successful part of the school. Most children progress from Year 6 to Year 7 which is quite unusual in an international context and very few students are withdrawn during their secondary education; this demonstrates the trust that the parents have in Sri KDU® International School.

This academic year will be an extremely important one in terms of our achievements as, in March 2020, we will have our re-accreditation visit for ISQM. Our aim is to retain the Gold status which we were awarded in February 2017. This time we will have an additional aspect to the inspection as we wish to gain BSO (British Schools Overseas) accreditation. Our consistent high standards in academic outcomes, pastoral care and holistic education allow us to be very confident of being successful in both BSO and ISQM accreditation. We have a large number of new staff this academic year, so we will all need to come together quickly and effectively as a high-performing team to make this happen.

I am delighted to have Andrew Wyeth and Katie Tomlinson leading the day-to-day operations and success of the secondary and primary sections of the school. This is the first year that the school will have a Head of Secondary and it might take me a while to get used to having one, however I am sure it will give me the opportunity to be more effective strategically. This is very important in an ever-changing world, with the educational landscape globally as well as locally needing to adapt. We also have some changes in our ownership to navigate soon, so I will use my different role to ensure that SKIS continues to be the vibrant, successful and happy school that it is.

We have continued to educate our students in areas that will inspire them to want to make a difference in the world. The students' commitment to environmental matters is demonstrated through our Eco-Schools programme throughout the year but especially through the annual Eco-Day. We have an Environmental Policy for all to follow and many areas of the curriculum as well as PSHLE teach about the importance of

sustainability. We were re-assessed for the Green Flag from WWF Malaysia, just before the end of the last academic year, so I hope to hear very soon that we have retained this prestigious award.

Early in the new academic year, the students will be choosing the two charities which they would like their fund-raising to support. Part of the education at SKIS is to ensure that the students understand that not everyone is as fortunate as they are and through our charity work they have the opportunity to experience this first-hand and to really make a difference to the lives of others. Last academic year, the students raised money to support the service learning trip to Cambodia as well as donating a substantial amount of money to PAWS (a local animal charity) and to United Voice (a charity for young adults with learning disabilities). Our students are very committed to making a difference in the world and have lots of fun whilst trying to achieve this.

I believe we have an excellent team of highly able teachers who can awaken joy in the students and develop them as learners rather than simply getting the best academic results.
