We are seeking to appoint a full-time teacher of science to join a highly successful science department from either April 20th, 2020 or September 1st, 2020. Applications are welcome from experienced and newly qualified teachers able to teach science throughout the age and ability range from Key Stage three to Key Stage five where the successful candidate would be able to offer A level chemistry. Science is highly successful at GCSE where performance has been significantly above national average, and very popular in the Sixth Form where many students continue with science based studies at university.

Students are taught a mixed KS3 skills based curriculum in years 7 and 8. They study core aspects of biology, chemistry and physics, with a real emphasis on scientific literacy and practical skills which will aid them when studying GCSE and Alevel sciences.

Students begin studying AQA GCSE material in year 9. Triple science is a popular option which students choose to study in year 10 and 11. Other students continue to study core and additional science. At A-level large numbers choose to study biology, chemistry, physics, or a combination of two or more.

At AS level, we currently have 44 chemists, 44 biologists, and 32 physicists.

At A2, we have 26 chemists, 18 biologists, and 23 physicists.

The work in the department is supported by three specialist technicians.

The science department is made up of large dynamic team with a strong ethos of collegiality. New comers to the profession will be supported by a highly experienced team.

Lampton School is a mixed, multi-ethnic 11-18 school that gained Academy status through the fast track 'outstanding' route in September 2010. We were awarded National Teaching School status in July 2011. Lampton School was judged as "outstanding" in all categories by Ofsted in May 2008 and again in May 2013. It was also featured in the Ofsted report 'Twelve outstanding secondary schools – Excelling against the odds'.

Lampton School is also a Teaching School, which supports teacher development in relation to outstanding pedagogy and leadership, as well as offering opportunities for career progression through outreach and school to school support.
