

RESPONSIBLE TO: Office Manager

JOB PURPOSE

- The post holder will work under the supervision of the SENDCo and line managed by the Office Manager to ensure that an efficient and effective administration service is provided to the SEND and wider administrative Team.

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Support the overall Christian ethos of the Trust.
2. Be aware of and comply with policies and procedures relating to child protection, health, safety and security, confidentiality and data protection, copyright etc. reporting all concerns to line manager.
3. Be aware of and support difference and ensure equal opportunities for all.
4. Contribute to the overall aims of the Trust.
5. To develop and implement own skills.
6. To be professional, friendly, fair and firm with students, demonstrating the sort of politeness and respectfulness that we wish them to emulate.
7. To show an excellent record of attendance and punctuality.
8. Work cooperatively as part of the Pastoral Team.
9. Possesses or must be willing to train for the First Aid at Work or Emergency First Aid at Work qualification approved by the HSE as requested.
10. Undertaking any other duties which may reasonably be regarded as within the nature of the duties and responsibilities/grade of the post as defined.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- Responsible for the administrative support/coordination for meetings such as Annual Reviews, Interim Reviews and ad hoc meetings including agenda preparation, collation of supporting papers, minute taking, production and distribution of minutes and any additional documentation.
- To undertake a comprehensive range of administrative services within the SEND department, ensuring that work is prioritised and deadlines are met.
- Maintain SEND student records both electronic and paper files including records are archived in line with the ICO regulations.
- Maintain, update and distribute documentation relating to SEND students including the Inclusive Education Register, IEPs and Pupil Passports.
- Co-ordinate routine and non-routine communication with service users on issues of a highly confidential and sensitive nature including parents and agencies such as other education establishments, health and other Local Authorities relating to SEND students.
- Support in developing SEND administration procedures and practices, making recommendations as appropriate.

General Administration

- To undertake a comprehensive range of administration tasks, ensuring that work is prioritised and deadlines are met.
- Contribute to the planning, development and organisation of office systems/procedures.
- Supporting with officer cover where necessary, during term time and the Academy holidays.
