

JOB DESCRIPTION

INTRODUCTION

Dwight School London believes that every member of the staff team makes an important contribution to our community and that contributions should not be limited by assigned responsibilities. Therefore, this job description identifies generic and specific individual responsibilities to enable the teacher to participate at Little Lions Nursery at Dwight in a full and effective way; it is not intended to restrict an individual's participation, especially in activities carried out voluntarily.

This job description reflects the post at the present time and may be reviewed and amended after consultation with the job-holder, at least once a year. Dwight School London is committed to protecting the welfare of students and all members of staff share the responsibility of safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all students in our care.



MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Be responsible for groups of children, including writing observations, assessing and planning for the various stages of children's development.
- As a team, assist in the planning and implementation of appropriate experiences for the children, both indoors and outdoors, to meet the learning and development requirements of the EYFS Statutory Framework.
- Work alongside the Nursery Manager and team to ensure that the Nursery's philosophy is fulfilled.
- Take shared responsibility for standards of safety, security, hygiene, cleanliness and tidiness throughout Nursery.
- As a team member, implement policies and procedures to ensure the welfare requirements
 of the Early Years Foundation Stage Statutory Framework are met, especially having a good
 understanding of the correct procedures to follow in the case of any child protection concerns.
- Liaise with and support parents and other families.
- Take an active role in the pastoral care of the children, reporting any concerns to the Nursery Manager.
- Attend INSET sessions, either as whole school, Nursery training or individually for professional development.
- Washing and changing children as required.
- To be aware of the high profile of the Nursery and to uphold its standards at all times, both within work hours and outside.
- To be flexible within working practices of the Nursery. Be prepared to help where needed, including to undertake certain domestic tasks within the Nursery, such as preparation of food, cleaning and sanitizing of resources and equipment.

OTHER DUTIES

- All staff at Dwight share responsibility for the welfare and safeguarding of students, which requires all staff members to complete regular training in safeguarding.
- The job holder may, from time to time, need to carry out other duties as reasonably directed by the Head of School, the Nursery Principal or their line manager.

SELECTION PROCESS


Candidates will be shortlisted and contacted once applications have closed
