### The Perse School



The Perse School is one of the country's leading independent day schools and a charitable company, educating 1,700 girls and boys aged 3-18. We are a very special school which is both traditional and innovative, ambitious and caring, understanding and structured, industrious and fun.

Located in Cambridge, we comprise of three schools, the Upper, Prep and Pelican. We also have two franchise Schools overseas in Singapore and Suzhou. Given the outstanding education offered, we are consistently over-subscribed and in strong financial health with an annual turnover of some £30 million. The School regularly achieves some of the best public examination results and university application outcomes in the UK.

In addition to the day to day curricular and co-curricular activities of the schools, The Perse provides public benefit to local and international communities. Over 70 pupils attend the School on means tested bursaries meaning they pay no or subsidised fees. This enables the Perse to be accessible to children irrespective of financial wealth. The Perse also works with 30 state schools in the UK and Christel House School overseas on projects to raise educational attainment.



### The Role



The Perse School is looking to appoint a high achieving graduate to join an extremely successful, collaborative and enthusiastic department. Pupils at The Perse School are ambitious, intelligent and industrious and this is an exciting opportunity to motivate and inspire talented pupils and staff alike in a fast-paced working environment.

The Perse believes that excellent schools need great teaching and support staff, who whilst operating within agreed school polices and to high standards of performance are given encouragement to innovate in pursuit of professional excellence. The result is a vibrant community of staff who spark off one another, share ideas, and come together to help pupils thrive academically, pastorally and in extra-curricular areas. All Perse teachers are expected to contribute to the pastoral and extra-curricular programme alongside their subject teaching.

The Perse is proud of its academic achievements, but also recognises the importance of pastoral care and a vibrant programme of extra-curricular activities in developing happy, well rounded and successful young people. # The Art Department



The Art department is a dynamic and creative hub of the school which is currently led by Ben Keeble (Head of Art), supported by three Art Teachers. The department is very well resourced in a purpose-built Art centre which includes a 6th form art studio, a ceramics room, a print room, general teaching rooms and a computer suite, all within the art block. Exhibition space is available in the skylight Gallery and Pelican Gallery in the Sir Peter Hall Performing Arts Centre. There is a dedicated full-time Art technician who supports the department in all aspects of their work.

The department has run visits to the Curwen Print Study Centre, various galleries and residential trips both in the UK and abroad. Every year, a variety of visiting artists and creative thinkers deliver workshops and lunchtime talks. We also offer extra-curricular activities including Jewellery Club, Ceramics club and Art Society.

The department enters pupils into various national competitions, including ARTiculation, The Saatchi Schools Award, Royal Academy Young Artists exhibition, The Cambridge Drawing Society Exhibition and The National Association of Decorative and Fine Arts Society Award, which has led to work being exhibited at the Mall Galleries.

All students at The Perse School study Art in years 7 and 8. Students can then opt to take Art in year 9 and again at both GCSE level and A level. The school currently follows the Edexcel specification for both GCSE and for A-level. Expectations are high, and examination results are strong. In 2021, our students gained 100% 7, 8 and 9 grades in GCSE Art (of which 89% were level 8 and 9) and 100% A\*/A grades in A Level Art.

Each year students go on to read Architecture and Fine Art related disciplines at foundation and degree level at university. The successful applicant will have a genuine enthusiasm for the creative arts and will have the ability to inspire all pupils and staff and nurture continued growth in the department. # Key responsibilities



Art and Design is at the heart of all learning; "Art makes children powerful" (Bob & Roberta Smith, 2012). Visual literacy is increasingly important in the modern world, and helping children navigate the complexities of image making and content creation is at the heart of what we do as educators in the creative industries.

#### **Accountability**

The Teacher of Art is ultimately accountable to the Head through the Senior Deputy Head but day to day accountability will be to the Head of Department.

The following duties shall be deemed to be included in the professional duties which the Teacher may be required to perform:

#### Curriculum

- Teaching throughout in a manner appropriate to students' ages and abilities;
- Assessing and recording students' progress in accordance with departmental and school policies;
- Preparing students for university applications in related subjects;
- Promoting and teaching Key Stage 3, GCSE and A Level Art;
- Using digital systems to deliver high quality teaching including setting work remotely and managing synchronous lessons
- Attending and contributing to departmental meetings;
- Developing and sharing teaching and learning resources;
- Monitoring the work and progress of pupils, including those with specific learning needs;
- Maintaining professional skills through INSET and our Professional Development programme;
- Producing displays and working with the technician on exhibitions to create an attractive learning environment.







#### Extra-curricular and pastoral

All teachers at The Perse School are required to be a form tutor and contribute to the extra-curricular programme, alongside their academic teaching. These elements of a teacher's role are fundamental to working at the school and embedded in our core values. Part time teachers are required to make a proportionate contribution to:

- the extra-curricular life of the school through Games, the Enrichment Programme or other appropriate creative commitment such as lunchtime clubs and societies;
- form tutoring;
- the PSHEE or Emotional Wellbeing programme.

#### Safeguarding

The School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.

- High Class Honours Degree in Art or a related subject;
- PGCE desirable but by no means essential;
- Excellent digital skills and experience in teaching Photography and / or Digital Image making would be an advantage;

- Experience working in creative teams and with young people to help them achieve their very best;
- Experience using Microsoft teams is desirable but not essential.

- Flexibility and to teach aspects of Design and Technology would be an advantage, but not essential;
- Demonstrates high standards of behaviour and is able to model the School values (intellectual curiosity and scholarship, endeavour, breadth and balance, and valuing one another and the environment);
- Proven communication and interpersonal skills;
- High level of literacy, attention to detail and ability to use initiative;
- High order administrative skills, including use of digital systems to effectively manage commitments and deadlines;
- Respects and values the different experiences, ideas and backgrounds others can bring to work and to teams;
- Emotional resilience to cope with and learn from challenging situations.

The Perse has a long record of training and developing teachers in situ, and many highly successful teachers started with no formal teaching qualifications. For applicants without a teaching qualification we are looking for: a high level of subject knowledge, enthusiasm, good communication skills, patience, an empathy with young people and a desire to get involved in the extra-curricular life of the school. The Perse supports unqualified teachers in achieving Qualified Teacher Status and the Post Graduate Certificate of Education qualification whilst working at the School.

#### **Early Career Teachers**

The School is fully accredited to participate in the Independent Schools Teacher Induction Panel Early Career Teacher Programme (IStip: https://istip.co.uk/about/). ECTs are provided with a comprehensive induction and mentoring programme which supports them in achieving qualified teacher status.

#### **Interviews**
