The Extended Leadership Team (ELT) consists of the Senior Leadership Team, the Heads of Learning Area, the Advanced Skills Teachers and the 2nd i/c of pastoral care. The ELT support the Principal in both the day-to-day running of the Academy and in shaping the medium and longer-term strategy for maintaining outstanding student outcomes.
