Duke of Kent School is a co-educational day school with 340 pupils from Nursery to Year 11. The School is organised into three sections: Pre-Prep (Nursery to Year 2); Prep (Year 3 to Year 6) and Senior (Year 7 to Year 11).

We are looking for an Art and DT Technician to join our innovative, forward-looking Art and Design Technology Department from September 2024. This is a part-time role, 24 hours over 3 days a week, with exact days and hours to be mutually agreed and dependent upon timetabling.

The successful candidate will be an integral member of the Art and DT team and an excellent communicator. We are looking for a team player, keen to share ideas with colleagues, who is self-motivated and committed to working with young people and to developing their knowledge alongside students in both subject areas, sharing the school's ethos of lifelong learning. Applicants will divide their time between the Art Studio and DT Workshop as required and experience of working in both these environments or similar will be an advantage.

### 2. School Information

Duke of Kent School strives for excellence, expects and celebrates effort, nurtures well-being and presents challenge. Our size allows each pupil to be known and cared for as an individual.

The School has undergone considerable change in the past 13 years, transforming itself from a Prep to a through school, and growing quickly to its current roll of 340 pupils. Key entry points are Nursery, Year 3 and Year 7. Pupils leave at the end of Year 11 to a wide range of local colleges and sixth forms in the independent and maintained sectors.

Our teaching team is made up of experienced, well qualified and highly motivated teachers who have chosen to join our small community where they have a big impact. A dedicated and comprehensive operations staff team supports the teaching team. Across both support and teaching areas, the School currently employs approximately 100 staff (both full-time and part-time). We are also complimented by a team of committed local Governors with broad expertise.

We have a growth mindset, operating on the principle that all learners can, when properly challenged and supported, achieve extraordinary progress. Our focus is on achieving personal best in every aspect of development. We expect, and celebrate effort.

Duke of Kent School works in partnership with parents to support and promote all aspects of pupils' development. We prepare our pupils to play a positive role in their adult lives, as independent learners and thinkers, and to be responsible members of the local and global community.

The School has an inclusive ethos and we are proud of meeting the needs of pupils across a broad range of academic ability. We seek to enable each pupil to achieve his or her potential, to address challenges and to develop interests and aptitudes.

### The Art and DT Department

The Duke of Kent School Art and Design Technology Department aims to develop creative, questioning students, adept in a wide variety of practical skills, techniques and processes, who have the ability to put these into practice effectively, in order to fulfil their creative potential. We promote a rigorous approach to learning in the Department, recognising the complexity and depth of both these subjects as well as the similarities and differences between the two disciplines. In doing so we are reflecting the forward-looking, interconnected nature of the professional world of art, design and technology.

The Department is split into two areas; an Art Studio and a DT Workshop. These areas house a wide variety of equipment including a printing press, photographic studio, ceramics kiln, laser cutter, 3D printer as well as a digital suite. This allows students to explore a wide variety of media, materials, techniques and processes. In Years 3-9 students receive an hour of Art and DT each week, this increases to 3 hours at GCSE. In addition, both subject areas run after school activities, lunch clubs and competitions throughout the year. The breadth of study and variety of processes available for students is integral to an inclusive department where every child's contribution is valued.

The Art and DT Department delivers a curriculum that provides students with a continuum of developmental, educational experiences from Year 3 to Year 9. At GCSE students can opt to follow Edexcel courses in Art and Design (Art, Craft and Design), and Design Technology (Textiles or Timbers).

We work closely with the Learning Development Department to ensure that pupils receive any necessary support. The highest achieving students benefit from activities, at School and further afield, designed to stretch and challenge them further.

We aim to extend and develop a passion and interest in Art and Design Technology, recognising the relevance of these areas outside of a school context. Visits to the Tate Modern and other galleries give contextual support to drawing and photography trips to sites such as Westminster Abbey, local sculpture gardens and Brighton seafront. GCSE students visit galleries and go on research trips to support their coursework projects.
