- Accompany teachers and students on Wednesday subject excursions in and around London
- Work effectively within a team to deliver excellence in student experience.

Child protection, discipline, health and safety

- Promote and safeguard the welfare of children and young persons for whom you are responsible and with whom you came into contact;
- Undertake Safeguarding training (Level 2) and relevant health and safety training
- Maintain good order and discipline among the students
- Safeguarding student health and safety; both when they are on the School premises and when they are engaged in authorised School activities elsewhere.
- Enforcement of school policies, rules, health and safety guidelines, code of dress, behaviour
- Develop a positive and supportive relationship with pupils.
