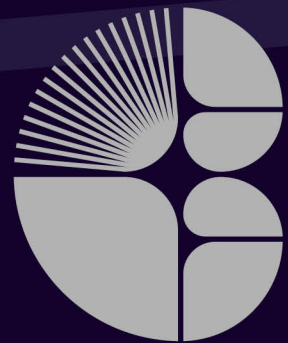

THE ROLE

- To work as part of Creative Education Trust's centralised Education Team to improve teaching and raise standards in Science across the Trust.
- To lead the strategy for the teaching of Science across the secondary academies in the Trust.
- Support individual schools and leaders throughout the year in their approaches to teaching Science
- Lead the Science Heads of Department group and meetings
- Contribute to the professional learning calendar for teachers across the Trust including NQT training, staff development and conference planning
- Work with the Director of Progress to assist in moderation and understanding of Science results across the Trust
- Support priority academies across the Trust in pursuing rapid improvement in Science

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide a strategic guide to the teaching of Science throughout the Trust
- Assist in setting key priorities for the Trust and the individual schools
- Provide advice and training to schools for the teaching of Science to develop and enhance the teaching practice across the Trust

- To raise standards of attainment and achievement across the Trust
- Analyse strengths and weaknesses in the teaching of Science from Trust-wide data
- Maintain an expert knowledge of teaching and research strategies in relation to teaching standards and effective classroom practices in the teaching of Science
- Assist in developing effective Heads of Department at school level
- Lead the process of moderation for Science across the Trust, ensuring that clear guidance and support is provided
- Identify and work with lead practitioners across the Trust
- Report on all aspects of developments within Science to the Directors within the Education Team.

This job description is not necessarily a comprehensive definition of the post, and the post holder will be required to undertake other duties appropriate to the grade and character of the work as directed.

The job description will be reviewed at least once a year and it may be subject to modification or amendment at any time after consultation with the post holder.

The duties may be varied to meet the changing demands of the school at the reasonable discretion of the Director of Performance.
