Vision Statement

The schools in the Diocese of Westminster Academy Trust, each according to their unique charism, are part of the mission of the Catholic Church "to preach the Gospel to all nations: to enrich all people with the light of the Good News, which, by its essence, is aimed at transforming the human person and setting him or her on the path that leads to salvation" (1).

With Christ at the centre of our hearts and of our schools, we are committed to the flourishing of our children and young people, so that they might grow in excellence and learn how to use their skills and knowledge for the common good, for the sake of their sisters and brothers in the world, especially the poor and marginalized.

We believe that every pupil is made in the image of God, with God-given gifts and God-given dignity: a divine origin and an eternal destiny. We believe that no pupil's background or start in life should determine their future. We commit ourselves to a preferential option for the poor, so that our disadvantaged and vulnerable pupils enjoy as much opportunity and academic success as their peers.

Our school communities will be distinguished by an atmosphere "permeated with the Gospel spirit of freedom and love" (2). Our pupils will experience their dignity in the way that they are loved, encouraged, accompanied and celebrated on their journey through school. Our belief in the dignity of the person will be expressed in particular in a commitment to promoting social and racial justice.

As a trust of Catholic schools, we are committed to working together in a trusting and collaborative manner, with integrity and transparency. We will model the leadership in the trust and in our schools on the example of our Teacher, Jesus Christ, "who came into the world to give witness to the truth, to save and not to judge, to serve and not to be served." (3).

We will encourage a commitment in our schools to the stewardship of the earth, our common home and invite our pupils to be good citizens, agents of positive change in the world, helping to build up God's kingdom of peace and justice.

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God"

Gospel value: Peace, committed to peacemaking, non-violence
