The Moat School

The Moat School is a thriving independent day school for boys and girls aged 9 to 18 years old. It specialises in supporting pupils with dyslexia, dyspraxia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia and other specific learning needs to achieve their potential. Located in Fulham and we also have a Sixth Form locted in Hammersmith which was opened in 2020.

Offering small classes and a caring, nurturing environment, the school allows all children, regardless of their educational starting point, to make progress. Pupils follow the National Curriculum and study GCSE and BTEC qualifications with a view to progressing on to further and higher education, or into employment. The Moat Sixth Form focuses not only on A-Level and BTEC qualifications but also accommodates a varied work experience programme for all its pupils.

The school is conveniently located close to Putney Bridge station and is next to the historic Fulham Palace. It is minutes from Fulham FC football ground and Bishop's Park where the school runs regular extracurricular activities. The Sixth Form, located off King Street in Hammersmith, is moments away from the Thames and Ravenscourt Park Station.

The Cavendish Education Group

In Sept 2017, The Moat School joined the Cavendish Education Group - a family of eleven schools focused exclusively on enabling children and young people with unique learning profiles (dyslexia, dyspraxia, autism and social and communication needs) to be the very best they can be.

The schools in the Cavendish Group do not focus on the things a child can't do - rather, they focus on an individual's strengths, talents and interests, and wholeheartedly believe that 'if a child can't learn the way we teach, then we must teach the way they learn'.

Each school has its own distinctive character, atmosphere and facilities, but they all provide a well-rounded, differentiated and skilfully-supported academic curriculum. Sport, technology, the arts, outdoor education and life skills all feature highly in enrichment activities.

Job Description

Learning Support Assistants at The Moat School are assigned to work with a group of 12 (or fewer) pupils who are members of a Form Group.

LSAs work with both pastoral and academic staff to enhance and enrich the learning experience of the pupils.

The context for this work is varied, encompassing both the classroom and educational experiences beyond the classroom. All LSAs are encouraged and enabled to take part in additional training to become qualified in supporting the needs of learners with SpLDs. Many are graduates looking to enter the teaching profession on leaving The Moat.
