Main purpose of job	The post holder will be expected to teach across the full age and ability range at Ashton on Mersey School. The post holder will lead and manage the ACE (Academy, Colleges and Education) Rugby Programme in conjunction with the Junior Academy at Sale Sharks Rugby Club.

Key responsibilities:

Teaching and Learning

- To plan teaching enabling excellent progress for pupils of all abilities
- To set high expectations for pupil behaviour; to establish and maintain an excellent standard of discipline through well-focused teaching and through positive and productive relationships
- To use a variety of teaching methods, including ICT, which sustain the momentum of pupil work and keep all pupils engaged
- To deliver excellent lessons for pupils across all key stages in a specific subject
- To make effective use of assessment information to inform planning and maximise progress
- To mark and monitor classwork and homework, providing constructive oral and written feedback and setting appropriate targets
- To develop, evaluate and update schemes of work across all key stages
- To keep accurate and up-to-date records
- To be familiar with school assessment and reporting requirements and know how to prepare and present information reports to parents

ACE Programme Leadership and Management

- Compose and circulate the session plans for the ACE Development group.
- Lead and populate the weekly schedule for individual and positional skill sessions.
- Coordinate the strength, conditioning and physio programmes.
- Promote and recruit potential players for the programme / sixth form.
- To deliver Individual Development Plans to a group of players.
- To lead delivery of DiSE (Diploma in Sporting Excellence)
- Utilise video analysis effectively.
- Lead ACE programme rugby trials
- Provide regular progress reports to the Junior Academy Manager.
- Assist in building and promoting a culture of sporting and academic excellence throughout the rugby programme.
