Job Detail

The German department is a thriving department which is energetic, enthusastic and forward-looking. As a result of German's increasing popularity as a language choice, we are looking to appoint an experienced German teacher to join the team.

All year 7 pupils study German as part of a language carousel, with Year 8 pupils opting for two of the three languages sampled in Year 7. In Year 9 pupils continue with their 2 languages, before opting for their GCSE courses. Our KS3 curriculum balances grammatical foundations with cultural and creative topics to enthuse and inspire German language learning and provide the firm foundations for further study at GCSE and beyond.

At GCSE and A level we follow the AQA syllabus with many of our students going on to study German further at university. We have had much success in recent years with our students winning national competitions for German and the enthusiasm for the subject is growing in KS3. An enthusiatic and imaginative German teacher is sought for September 2020 to teach across all Key Stages. The successful candidate will be experienced in teaching German to GCSE and A-level.

In addition to teaching, the person appointed will be a team player, assisting with departmental tasks and with some of the department's many extra curricular activities. We offer a number of trips in the department such as Year 9 trip to Cologne, Year 7 trip to the Rhine, a Christmas visit to Berlin and an exchange.

Other Duties

Part of the role will also involve helping with the pastoral development of pupils, acting as a form teacher who is responsible for registering pupil attendance and for monitoring the overall progress of a group of pupils.

All staff are encouraged to make an additional contribution to the life of the school which depends on their own interests. Possible areas include drama, music, sport, boarding duties and the combined cadet force.
