Eaton House The Manor

The Eaton House Group of Schools comprises of six individual schools spread across three different sites. All the Schools are well known for their academic prowess and outstanding results across the board. With approximately 220 boys, the intimate nature of the School provides a supportive and warm environment in which the boys flourish individually. We aim to develop and nurture each pupil and encourage the boys to achieve their best in the academic, creative and sporting fields. Pupils are offered a broad, balanced curriculum and are helped to develop their independence within this framework. At the same time the pupils are encouraged to have good manners and respect for each other. These principles are key aspects of their life at school.

Eaton House The Manor is situated on Clapham Common and is housed in a beautiful Grade II listed building dating back to 1792. The school has extensive new facilities, finished in 2017 and includes a new state of the art science laboratory.

Eaton House The Manor Preparatory School

Eaton House the Manor Prep is a three-form entry school and has a selective entrance exam at 8+ with boys joining in Year 4 from our own pre-prep and other schools. Although entry is selective for both internal and external candidates, the majority of boys join us from our own pre-preparatory school. The boys are taught by a Class Teacher in Years 4 and Years 5. For the final three years of the Prep School (Years 6 – 8) the boys have subject specialists for all subjects. The Science Department includes a Head of Science, a Science Teacher and a Laboratory Technician.

Job Description and Responsibilities

- Following Eaton House the Manor's science scheme of work, in preparing boys for 13+ Common Entrance.
- To plan, deliver and review differentiated lessons which are appropriate to the age, ability and need of pupils.
- To set clear and achievable targets for student improvement.
- To regularly mark, assess and record pupils' work in accordance with school policies in order to monitor student progress.
- To create a positive learning environment for the students.
- To use interesting, inspiring and innovative displays.
- To have concern and responsibility for the safety of students at all times, with reference to the school's Safeguarding and Health and Safety Policies.
- To have an enthusiasm to take on responsibility for the organisation of extra-curricular activities, trips and visits
- To attend INSET as required by the Head Teacher.
- To attend Staff Meetings, Parent's Evenings and any other functions as required.
- To play a full part in the life of the school and undertake pastoral/supervisory duties as enquired
- To be accountable to the Head of Department.

Salary

The School has its own competitive salary scale which is reviewed annually. The DfES Pension Scheme is available to all staff.
