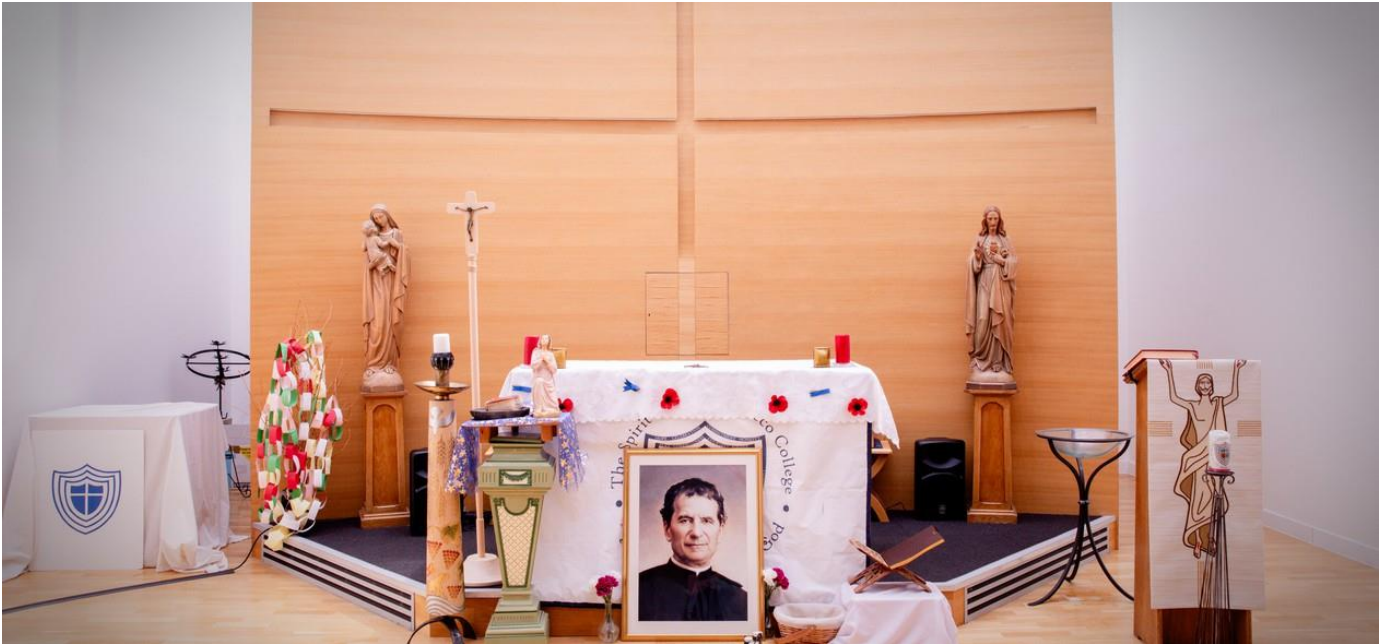

St John Bosco College is part of an international community of schools located all across the world all taking their inspiration from Don (Father) Bosco, a remarkable priest who dedicated his life to the service of young people in the poorest part of Turin, NE Italy, in the 19th century. He founded the Salesian religious teaching order, named after the gentle saint Francis De Sales, dedicated to serving young people in the most deprived and challenging circumstances and accompanying them on their journey to becoming 'good Christians and honest citizens able to earn their own bread'. His educational philosophy, that children 'need to know that they are loved' was radical for its day, but has stood the test of time. Today over 3500 Salesian schools can be found on every continent and at St John Bosco College we have close links with schools as far apart as India, Italy and Mexico.

- Work effectively as part of a team and liaise with, deploy, and guide the work of other adults who support students' learning
- Use a variety of teaching methods and styles appropriate to the range of ability of the students being taught
- Ensure a standard of behaviour that enables students to learn
- Undertake the teaching of those classes assigned under the school timetable
- Be accountable for pupils' attainment, progress and outcomes in all classes
- Support in planning and curriculum development under the guidance of head of department.
- Take an active role in departmental curriculum reviews to feedback student experiences of learning.

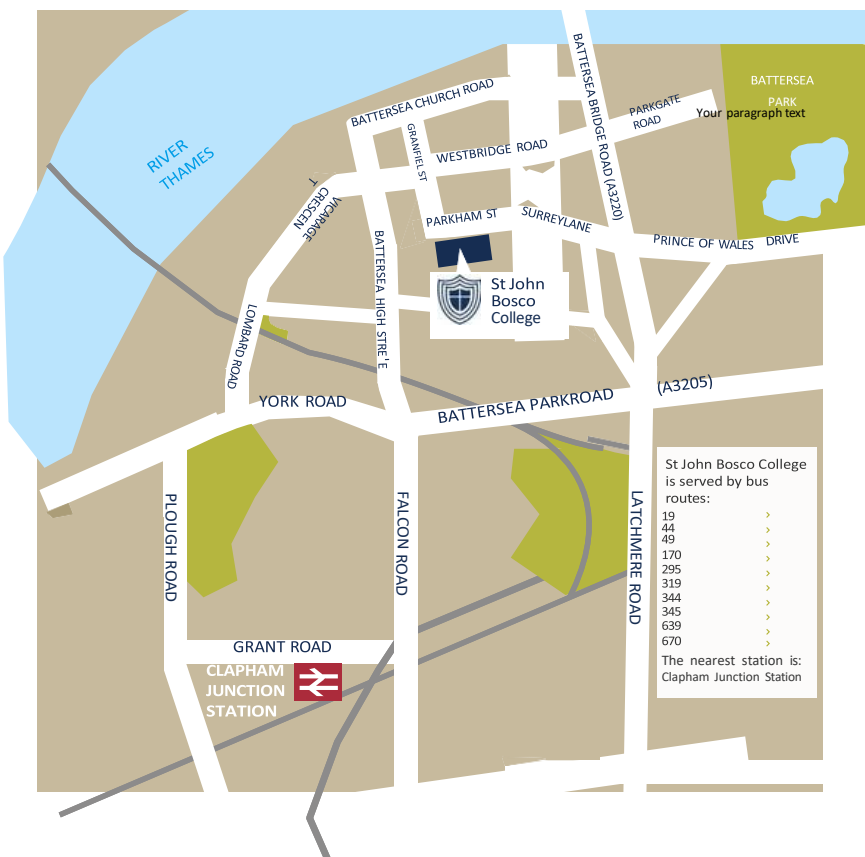


WHY ST JOHN BOSCO COLLEGE IS A GREAT PLACE TO WORK
