General Information

Francis Holland School Sloane Square is an independent selective school for about 570 girls aged 4 to 18 (GSA and HMC). There are around 165 Juniors and over 400 Seniors, including 100 in the Sixth Form. The School is located on a spacious site in a quiet area of SW1, very close to Sloane Square.

Pupils come from all parts of the London area with many of the Junior School pupils choosing to stay for the Senior School. Each member of staff is involved in the pastoral life of the School, normally as a Form Tutor, the Junior School having one form throughout and Years 7

to 11 having two or three forms per year. The Sixth Form girls are placed in tutor groups of about 8 girls. A very wide range of co-curricular opportunities are offered to the pupils, and all staff contribute to this vibrant dimension of the School.

Academic standards are high throughout the School and on leaving school, after A Levels, girls all proceed to higher education courses, sometimes after a gap year.

Psychology Departmental Information

The Psychology department is a leading department in the Sixth Form at Francis Holland. It is also one of the most popular choices at A-level. Students are very enthusiastic about the subject and a significant proportion go on to take the subject at university.

We offer a rich programme of external speakers to give pupils the opportunity to experience the subject beyond the examination curriculum. We also have two Psychologists in Residence who run weekly talks during two terms on topics ranging from “Does free will exist?” to “The Psychology of Dating”.

The students thrive on independent work and with this in mind the department has extensive online resources including further reading, videos, polls, personality tests and blogs.
