

Our teaching is project based and students will explore key areas of film and television production. They will also study English, maths and a cultural enrichment programme so that they are fully equipped to find their way in the world.

We place a strong emphasis on the development of well rounded young people in and beyond the classroom. Through our pastoral, tutorial and enrichment programmes, we will equip our students with the life skills needed to progress in their professional and personal lives. Our students will all be known well by staff and challenged and supported to realise their potential. And crucially, within our newly refurbished stunning building LSA will be a safe, accepting, diverse and fun place to study.

If prospective students are passionate about the worlds of film and television, know the importance of hard work, love a challenge, follow advice, thrive on working in teams and demonstrate a positive attitude, LSA will be the perfect match.

The screen industries are a large part of the creative industries and cover all work in film and television. Music videos, commercials, games, visual effects (VFX), animation and digital platform content also come under the banner of the screen industries – in fact anything that you watch or interact with on a screen.

Across the world the screen industries are rapidly expanding. Britain is celebrated as a world leader in this field and the majority of work across film and television is based in London. The exceptional growth in these industries has created many recognised skills shortages and therefore great employment opportunities now and in the future.

Crew members in film and television work in many different jobs; each with their own specific skills and responsibilities working towards a common goal. They work together in a disciplined manner to bring a story to life.

We know there are many young people across London with the ability to have successful and rewarding careers in the screen industries. LSA is here to provide students from all backgrounds with the opportunity to excel in these careers, progress to higher education or to succeed in other professions. We aim to give students the opportunity to develop specific skills in the areas they find most interesting and an appreciation of the art of storytelling.



#### LSA is deeply rooted in the screen industries.

Working Title Films, Heyday Films, Eon Productions and Lisa Bryer are together with leading educational professionals the architects of the LSA curriculum. They have been instrumental in developing LSA as they share a strong desire to resolve the inconsistencies and skills shortages across both the film and television industries.

**TIM BEVAN CBE** and **ERIC FELLNER CBE** began their careers in the screen industries as runners straight from school. Since 1992, Tim and Eric have worked together as Co-Chairmen of Working Title Films, one of the world's leading film production companies that has produced *Love Actually*, the *Johnny English* films, *Darkest Hour* and *Baby Driver*. Their partnership has resulted in Working Title Films producing over 100 films that have grossed \$7.5 billion, and have won 14 Academy Awards<sup>\*</sup> and 40 BAFTA awards.

Working Title works extensively with Into Film, a national organisation that aims to empower the educational and personal development of young adults through the medium of film.



LISA BRYER who began her career as a runner straight from school set up Cowboy Films in 1990. Cowboy Films produced groundbreaking music videos for bands such as *The Cure, David Bowie* and *The Psychedelic Furs*. Cowboy Films also produced commercials for clients including BMW and Kleenex and short films including the Oscar<sup>®</sup> winning *Wasp*. After producing the box office success, *The Last King of Scotland*, which won an Academy Award<sup>®</sup> and many BAFTA awards, Lisa moved from production to pursue her passion in education and mental health for young adults. Lisa has been, and continues to be, a Governor and a Trustee for a number of schools and charities.

**DAVID HEYMAN** began his career as a runner, locking-off sets and making copious amounts of tea on films like *A Passage To India* and *Ragtime*. He went on to work as a Creative Executive at Warner Bros. and a Vice President at United Artists, before becoming a producer in his own right.

David's films have grossed over \$10 billion worldwide. He is perhaps best known for producing all eight *Harry Potter* films, the Academy Award<sup>®</sup> winning *Gravity*, and both adaptations of Michael Bond's *Paddington* books. Other films he has been involved with include *Juice*, *I Am Legend*, *We're The Millers*, *The Fault in Our Stars*, *Maze Runner* and *Fantastic Beasts*. Upcoming projects include new films from Quentin Tarantino and Noah Baumbach.

MICHAEL G. WILSON OBE and his sister BARBARA BROCCOLI OBE co-own EON Productions Limited, the UK based production company that has produced the *James Bond* films since 1962. Wilson and Broccoli have produced some of the most successful Bond films ever including *Skyfall* and *Spectre*.

They have produced and executive produced independent film projects including *Film Stars Don't Die in Liverpool* and *The Rhythm Section.* Additionally, they co-produced and co-financed theatrical productions that have played in London and on Broadway including *Once, Othello* and *The Kid Stays In The Picture.* 

In 2014, Broccoli and Wilson were honoured by the Producers Guild of America with the David O. Selznick Achievement Award in Theatrical Motion Pictures. NICK WATKISS, Principal Designate, has spent his career in schools serving disadvantaged communities. He is an experienced Headteacher at both secondary and primary level, has led high performing schools to achieve outstanding results and removed a London academy from Special Measures in record time.

Nick is passionate about the importance of ethos, culture and climate in his schools and he is dedicated to mentoring and developing school leaders at all levels.

Nick has been a Youth Adviser to the Mayor of London's Office, a Director of a Multi Academy Trust and an Executive Headteacher.

Nick originally trained as a classical musician at Goldsmiths, University of London and is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts.

**SIR NICK WILLIAMS**, Educational Adviser, has worked in the education profession since 1977. Most recently Nick was Principal of The BRIT School for Performing Arts and Technology where he built the BRIT's reputation as the UK's leading arts educator and proponent of specialist education for 14-19 year olds.

Nick has led the opening of two creative schools, Birmingham Ormiston Academy (BOA) and East London Arts and Music (ELAM), as well as a number of new schools for the Department for Education. Nick is leading LSA's team designing the creative curriculum and advising on school organisation.

Nick was knighted for his services to education in the 2013 New Year's Honours List.



JANE FRAZER, Screen Industry Adviser, has worked around the world as a freelance Line Producer in the production department of films and television since the 1980s. Her many credits include *My Beautiful Laundrette, Gosford Park, Atonement, The Grand Budapest Hotel* and *The Night Manager.* 

Jane has always worked hard to encourage young people to join the industry and is committed to helping them progress. Jane is delighted to be working alongside LSA's Founders to achieve the strongest screen industry links for LSA; from curriculum to employment opportunities.

Jane received the Women in Film & Television Project Management Award in 2011 and was part of the production team which won the Production Guild Team of the Year award in 2016.

# LSA Curriculum

In the first year LSA's curriculum will provide students with a broad knowledge of the many skills and disciplines within the screen industries. In the second year students may choose to specialise in a specific area.

Across both years all students will be taught storytelling as an integral part of the visual creative process. They will also explore the cultural and historical significance of film and television.

LSA's students will learn to improve their communications skills, work constructively within a team, gain basic business knowledge and develop self-management skills.

LSA's core course is the UAL Level 3 Extended Diploma in Creative Media Production and Technology, which is equivalent to three A-Levels (72-168 UCAS points).

Eight pods of learning will be taught through projects across the two year syllabus. These are:

- Script development, writing and direction
- Production which includes budgeting, locations, scheduling, health and safety and legal
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$  Art department which includes drafting, model making and props
- Costume, hair and make up
- Camera, lighting and sound
- VFX
- Post production and editing
- Publicity, marketing and distribution

In addition to the core course all students will study for qualifications in English and maths from GCSE up to A Level. These courses develop critical, reflective, problem solving and independent learning skills and are complimentary to the core course.

Students will also participate in an enrichment programme where they will focus on personal development, explore global citizenship issues and experience the many cultural offerings available in London.

Students will be taught by outstanding teachers and people who make their living working in film and television production. Together they will plan, teach and rigorously assess students' coursework. The progression routes throughout the two year course will be clear to all students.

LSA's curriculum currently focuses on film and television. As the screen industries evolve, our curriculum will too.

LSA will provide students with the knowledge, skills and understanding necessary to access and progress to degree level study and employment in the screen and creative industries through the Level 3 Extended Diploma in Creative Media Production & Technology.




