

Learning Support Specialist Teacher (English Specialism)

We are looking for a qualified Specialist Teacher to join us on a variable hours basis to support pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) with their literacy skills up to GCSE. Hours are subject to pupil timetable availability and specific timings will be confirmed from September, but ideally, we are looking for someone who has availability to teach on a Monday, Tuesday and Friday. The school day is 8.30am until 5.00pm but the flexibility to start at 8.00am may be required. This is a term time only position.

Job Purpose (SEND)

The Department of Enhanced Learning assists children of all ages who may be at risk of not meeting their academic potential because of specific learning differences. A Learning Support Specialist Teacher is able to provide tailored 1 to 1 differentiated teaching in order to support individual pupils, catering for their specific educational needs. They will ensure progress is being made by monitoring and tracking assessment scores and liaising with subject teachers.

The School

- Develop an Enhanced Learning Plan (ELP) for each pupil
- Disseminate suitable classroom strategies to subject staff, in liaison with HoLS, to enhance the learning experience of individual pupils in the classroom

- Advise subject teachers of classroom strategies for individual pupils
- Encourage and promote independent learning
- Promote the use of assistive technology to support learning when appropriate
- Motivate, praise and encourage positive behaviour
- Promote and reinforce the pupils' self esteem
- Encourage the pupils to take responsibility for their own actions
- Ensure the pupils are aware of, and uphold, the school rules
- Ensuring the safety of pupils at all times
- Supporting and contributing to the school's responsibility and policies regarding the safeguarding and welfare of children

Essential

- Be a high-quality specialist teacher who is proficient in a range of teaching and learning support approaches with expertise in English (up to and including GCSE)
- Demonstrate commitment to raising achievement and progress in pupils
- Will have Qualified Teacher Status and Level 7 diploma in Specific Learning Difficulties (SpLDs) especially dyslexia as a minimum
- Comfortable working with a wide age group (Year 7 and above)
- Comply with all current DBS and other safeguarding checks and standards

Desirable

- Experience of supporting younger children (up to and including Year 6) with their literacy skills
- The ability to assess pupils for SpLDs and EAAs
