ABOUT US

Sawtry Village Academy is an 11-18 mixed comprehensive school with 890 students (approximately 160 in the sixth form) situated in a rural village community. Our catchment extends beyond the village into 6 neighbouring villages and benefits from excellent links to the A1 to the North, Peterborough, and to the South, towards Huntingdon and Cambridge.

Our conversion to single Academy status took place in August 2011. However, following a change of leadership and governance, we joined a larger multi-academy Trust in April 2015, becoming the fifth secondary school to join CMAT. The Trust was formed with a simple and clear vision: "to ensure high quality education at the heart of the community".

In 2018, the Academy was graded Good with an Outstanding Sixth Form by Ofsted.

At Sawtry, we believe that educational success stems from aspiration and a personalised approach to learning where we guide students into making the right choices for their future. We invest time in developing positive relationships with student's so they have the skills and attributes that enable them to respect each other, be tolerant of differences, care for the environment and be responsible, successful members of society.

OUR VALUES

Sawtry Village Academy has high expectations of all its students and in return offers a high-quality education at the heart of its local community. We will develop our students into successful, confident, responsible and employable citizens. The school will be a supportive hub for its students, their families, and the community.

OUR CURRICULUM

We have an uncompromising commitment to ensure that every child achieves their academic potential at Sawtry Village Academy. Our curriculum has been carefully designed to secure the best possible outcomes for our students and to create well-rounded and cultured individuals.

Year 7 curriculum

Year 7 students at the Academy follow a new and exciting curriculum designed to help settle them into secondary education. This means that they study English, History, Geography, PE, Music, Languages, Technology, ICT/Computing, Core studies, Science and Mathematics.

Year 8 curriculum

By Year 8 the transition has been completed and the student immerses themselves in an exciting curriculum where English, Maths and Science are the core focus. At Sawtry Village Academy students follow the KS3 curriculum for three years. This means that during Year 8, students choose, with the guidance of their Form Tutors and parents, their key stage 4 programmes of study.

Year 9, 10 and 11 curriculum – key stage 4

Students begin their GCSE studies in Year 9, which provides time to develop breadth and depth before preparing for examinations in Year 11.

Our Guided Choices programme allows students to access the creative and technical subjects, such as Art, Music, Physical Education, Product Design, Textiles, Business Studies, ICT, Media Studies, Resistant Materials and Food Technology, alongside a curriculum that focuses on developing students' achievements in the core subjects: English, Maths, Science, History, Geography, Modern Foreign Languages, Core Studies (PSHE and RE) alongside practical PE.

The essence of the curriculum is to ensure that every child achieves his or her maximum potential in the pursuit of striving for excellence across all subjects.

Year 12 and 13 curriculum – A Level and Applied General Qualifications

The Academy is proud to have a very successful Post-16, commended in 5 consecutive Ofsted reports where it has now been graded as 'Outstanding'. Our curriculum and broader pastoral provision continues to offer courses that best suit our students, with the aim to set students up for both higher education, apprenticeships and careers in a variety of fields.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The Academy offers students a wide variety of extra curricular opportunities through a timetabled programme over the year. These encompass activities such as sports, environmental club, drama club (Encore), film making, music and additional subject support. The Academy day extends to 4pm for those students who wish to stay for after-school activities or additional curriculum assistance - these are called Session 6's.

THE HOUSE SYSTEM

Sawtry Village Academy has four main school houses and an additional 6th Form house. The Houses provide crucial support and guidance where the needs of every student are acknowledged and understood by their Tutor, Senior Tutor and Student Support Assistant. The House system enables individual progress to be monitored much more closely and the House is the key focus of the relationship between the Academy and their families.

The House offices are a great base for students and parents to find the support and assistance they may need. Each House has a dedicated member of the Senior Leadership Team, a Senior Tutor and a Student Support Assistant. There are 9 tutor groups per House, with each comprising of approximately 24 students ranging from Years 7 to 11.

ACADEMY PLEDGES

In order to support our curriculum, we have developed and invested in a set of Academy Pledges that students are expected to complete during the course of their time at the Academy, at Bronze, Silver and Gold levels.

Pledges are an awards system, which offer students a range of character-building opportunities that enhance their learning and development. The Pledges system aims to encourage and support many important qualities in students, such as responsibility, expectation, intuition, and citizenship, all of which are crucial for giving students skills and brighter futures.

There are also Pledge awards for staff along the same lines as the student system.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP TEAM

The Senior Leadership Team (SLT) consists of the Headteacher, a Vice Principal and 2 Assistant Principals. The Assistant Principals each have a specific whole school responsibility as well as managing a House(s) and associated departments.

STAFFING

There are 50 teaching staff and 40 other staff members (including Teaching Assistants and Support Staff). Teachers are well qualified and teach their subject specialism. There is a good balance of age and experience within teams, and staff enjoy working at the school. We recruit excellent staff and retention is high.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT AND PROGRESSION

We are committed to a staff led approach to professional development focused on sharing and embedding best practice across the school. On Tuesdays after school, staff are involved in a variety of Teaching & Learning sessions. Training is led by departments, Academy teaching staff as well as drawing on expertise across other Trust schools.

Other staff are offered job specific training opportunities.
