Context

The successful applicant will have an outstanding subject knowledge and a proven record of, or ambition for, teaching children how to master IT and preparing them for life at many leading senior schools including Eton, Harrow, Radley and Winchester.

With a passion for IT and the ability to live and breathe all things Google, he/she will be inspirational in both their teaching and their manner outside of the classroom. The role will include some day to day IT support alongside the Prep Schools Trust team who have oversight of our IT infrastructure.

Job Specification

- Teach ICT to Cothill pupils in Years 3-7.
- Manage the day to day running of the school's IT infrastructure with support from the Trust team.
- Teach another subject, coach sport or take part in some pupil facing provision.
- Potentially offer some lessons or activities in the fields of coding, robotics and/or artificial intelligence.
- Carry out duties in line with other teaching staff.
- Be involved in the wider life of the school, possibly including Music and/or Drama.
- Fulfill wider responsibilities as determined by the schools' leadership team in line with other staff commitments.
