# **JOB PURPOSE**

- To keep appropriate and efficient records, integrating formative and summative assessment into weekly and termly planning;
- To ensure that the current national conditions of employment for school teachers are met.

#### **Pastoral Care**

- To help promote and safeguard the welfare of all children.
- To promote self-discipline, high standards of behaviour and positive attitudes on the part of all children and to implement policies and procedures to foster them.
- Ensure that a high standard of care and good order for all children is maintained.

#### **Teaching**

- Prepare and deliver lessons to classes of different ages and abilities
- Mark work, give appropriate feedback and maintain records of students' progress and development
- Research new topic areas, maintaining up-to-date subject knowledge, and devise and write new curriculum materials
- Select and use a range of different learning resources and equipment, including podcasts and interactive whiteboards
- Prepare students for qualifications and external examinations
- Manage student behaviour in the classroom and on school premises, and apply appropriate and effective measures in cases of misbehaviour
- Undertake pastoral duties, such as taking on the role of form tutor, and supporting students on an individual basis through academic or personal difficulties
- Communicate with parents and carers over students' progress and participate in departmental meetings, parents' evenings and whole-school training events
- Liaise with other professionals, such as learning mentors, careers advisers, educational psychologists and education welfare officers
- Supervise and support the work of teaching assistants, trainee teachers and newly qualified teachers (NQTs) appropriate to experience level.
- Organise and participate in extracurricular activities, such as outings, social activities and sporting events

- To fully support the life and work of the school.
- To develop and maintain positive and effective professional relationships with colleagues, parents, the local community and Governors.
- To ensure that parents and pupils are well informed about the Key Stage curriculum, attainment and progress and are able to understand and contribute to targets for improvement.
