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# Media Studies at Rutlish School

We aim for our students to understand of a wide variety of media products and platforms, how they have developed over time and the processes necessary to produce them. Furthermore, we encourage students to consider how media is a reflection of the values that a society holds and the symbiotic relationship that exists between the members of a society and the media they consume. We aim to imbue an awareness of how media impacts people on a global level, how it might impact more locally and how individuals may be shaped in terms of their media consumption.

We strive to examine different aspects of society and the groups that it is made up of in order to better understand the world at large. Examining technological advance, representation of different groups and moral and technical standards all feed into how media students are encouraged to better know themselves and the world around them through the lens of media.

We also endeavour to develop key skills that prove an aptitude in creative media production such as investigating and developing ideas through pre-production, production and post-production of media products. Students will learn photography, videography, sound recording and Audio-visual editing at a basic level with a chance to develop more specialist skills in one of these areas. Our intention is that students follow a process that underpins effective ways of working in media, such as responding to briefs and feedback, planning and generating ideas. We aim to help students build upon their personal management and communication skills and cultivate knowledge of processes and attitudes in the sector.

## STAFF & FACILITIES

English and Media are taught in the Innes building in a suite of adjacent rooms. Media, ICT Suites, and a variety of other resources are readily available for use in all lessons. All members of the department are English specialists (with specialist Media Teachers within the department) and teach across the age and ability ranges. There is a strong team ethos and we enjoy our work.

## KS3

Students are allocated to sets after the first term in Year 7 and from then on are taught in sets in all year groups. All Key Stage 3 students receive seven hours of English a fortnight. We focus on ways to improve literacy and reading skills at Key Stage 3 and on how to more fully engage boys across the school in their learning processes. We see the national emphasis on literacy and reading as an opportunity for some interesting initiatives within English and across the curriculum. The English department at Rutlish School encourages independent reading through lessons in class and in the Library once a fortnight in KS3. Our English curriculum is rich, diverse and equips students not only with necessary academic skills to succeed in their next steps in education, but also enhances their personal development, cultural capital and facilitates a wider view of the world.

*Skills and knowledge relating to Media Studies are also embedded within the KS3 English curriculum.*

## KS4

**English:** Key Stage 4 students study GCSE English Language and GCSE English Literature and the Department currently enters students for examinations set by AQA. All Key Stage 4 students receive 7 hours of English a fortnight. 2023 GCSE results English grade 4+ 90%, grade 5+ 78% and grade 7+ 31%, which contributes to the overall success of the students at Rutlish.

**Media:** There are two courses in Media that run within the department; GCSE Media Studies and BTEC Creative Digital Media. Both courses are delivered at KS4 only and students receive 5 hours of teaching per fortnight.

The GCSE course is the AQA specification which addresses different forms of Media and considers their impact on society as a whole. It is a course that looks at contemporary examples of media, including advertising, television, newspaper, gaming, music production and film.

BTEC Media is a level 2 Tech Award in Creative Digital Media following the Edexcel specification (new for 2022). In this course, students will be exposed to different forms of media and must show how these can be used in the business world to effectively communicate with an audience. It is a course that looks at contemporary examples of media, including advertising, television, gaming, print media and film in the context of the workplace, with a digital, online focus.

Both courses require at least a basic understanding of key media concepts and Adobe editing software (training will be provided if necessary).

### **KS5:**

We offer English Literature and a variety of Media related courses in RR6, such as Media Studies, Film Studies and Photography. We teach our students in the Sixth Form in partnership with Ricards Lodge. Both Heads of Departments work closely with each other to ensure success of our students. RR6 (boys) is ranked among the top 20% of the non-selective state funded boys' schools in England.

The English and Media department is committed to raising achievement and believes it has a firm base from which to achieve this. We believe in the importance of academic, as well as character development of our students to ensure success in their next steps and enable them to confidently navigate the wider world.

- To regularly assess and record students' performance, reporting to the Heads of Departments (both Media and English) and to parents as required and advising on examination entries as appropriate
- To contribute to departmental and whole school development, participating in departmental and staff meetings as appropriate, creating schemes of work and resources, etc.
