Sherborne House School is a co-educational day school, sitting just outside of Chandlers Ford, Hampshire. Sitting in four acres of woodland, in the quiet village of Hiltingbury, it caters for 272 pupils between the ages of 6 months and 11 years. The school was inspected by the Independent Schools Inspectorate in July 2021, which rated it 'excellent in all areas'. THE CURRICULUM

The combination of a broad and balanced curriculum delivered through specialist teaching, along with dedicated preparation for 11+ entrance exams, ensures every child achieves their potential. Regular educational visits, projects and workshops offer the children a broad range of learning opportunities outside of the classroom from Reception upwards.

Sherborne House aims to encourage children to take ownership of their learning, providing distinct opportunities for them to encounter challenge and uncertainty, in order to develop resilience, collaboration, independence, and intrinsic motivation, and to appreciate their successes. Through significant investment in the school's IT infrastructure and hardware, Sherborne House provides children with up-to-date technology, enabling them to enhance their IT skills and literacy throughout the curriculum and beyond. Sherborne House equips children to work independently, collaboratively and safely in the wider modern world. Whilst Sherborne House has an excellent track record of helping its children achieve outstanding results, this is a by-product of the education offered and not the exclusive focus. The aim at Sherborne House is to ensure the children are engaged in their learning and are encouraged to think for themselves, to develop new interests and to question the world around them whilst appreciating the value of good manners, honesty and consideration for others.

LEAVERS' DESTINATIONS

At the end of their time at Sherborne House, the children achieve excellent results, allowing them to move onto a range of different schools in Hampshire and beyond. The Headteacher and Form Teachers work closely with parents to identify the most suitable school for each child, the one that will be just right for them. Pupils from Sherborne House School are offered places at King Edwards VI, Embley and the Salisbury Grammar Schools amongst others.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR

Sherborne House offers a wide variety of clubs every day which usually take place after school, with a few clubs also taking place at lunchtime. They include a range of performing arts activities, several sports clubs, and various arts and craft activities. Clubs are rotated and varied throughout the year and supplemented by visiting teachers who offer additional specialist clubs.

The after-school programme offers several clubs for each year group every school evening. Alternatively, children can attend Lakewood to finish their homework in a quiet environment then relax with friends up until 6pm. This gives parents flexibility for collection, safe in the knowledge that their children are doing something fun and constructive.

The school is open from 7:30am to 6pm every day during term time.

PASTORAL CARE AND PUPIL VOICE

Sherborne House School believes very strongly that all pupils need to feel secure and happy at school. They should know they will always be taken seriously, and listened to when things are troubling them. At Sherborne House, all pupils have a Form Tutor who is responsible for their pastoral care.

Personal, social and health education (PSHE) and citizenship - encompassing Fundamental British Values (FBVs) is an important part of the curriculum, and promotes the discussion of sensitive issues within a supportive and caring environment. The programme includes visits from outside agencies who approach age-appropriate issues in a sensitive and professional manner.

At Sherborne House, pupil voice gives groups of pupils the opportunity to meet and discuss different ways in which they can better the school community. Using feedback from all the pupils in school, through surveys and class discussions, each school committee is the driving force behind creating solutions and implementing initiatives to give each child the best school experience.



NURSERY



The Sherborne House School Nursery caters for children from the age of six months to four years, offering the highest quality care in a safe, engaging and nurturing environment. The Sherborne House Nursery follows the Early Years foundation stage (EYFS) Curriculum and ensures that each phase of a child's learning is extended through wider experiences inside and outside the classroom.

The children learn in very small class sizes through a combination of planned and child-initiated, stimulating play activities. Following the seven prime areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum, teaching topics are led by the children's interests. The children in Owls class (aged 3 - 4 years) also benefit from weekly specialist French, music and P.E lessons which help to broaden their curriculum and experiences further.

The nursery is open all year-round Monday to Friday from 7:30am until 6pm.

COMMUNITY

Sherborne House encourages all pupils, from the youngest in Nursery to the eldest in Year 6, to play a positive role in contributing to the life of the school and the wider community.

The school aims to help pupils think about how people really can make a difference to local, national and global issues. By giving children the opportunity to understand and learn more about the characteristics of individuals and organisations that show vision, compassion, dedication and generosity, the school aims to inspire the children to believe they can make a greater impact and difference in the local community and beyond.

Sherborne House aims to create links with the community through partnerships with local schools and charities, participating in fundraising events and by welcoming external visitors to talk to the children in weekly assemblies.

In addition, Parents and supporters of Sherborne House School are all part of the parents' association, FOSH. FOSH organises fun events throughout the academic year which benefit the school.
