Letter from RKLT Chief Executive Officer

I am delighted to have the opportunity to invite you to apply for the post of Headteacher of Harrogate Grammar School, a simply brilliant school situated in a town recently described as the happiest in Britain! The chance to lead this school does not come very often; there have been only seven different leaders since the school was founded in 1903. I have had the enormous privilege and pleasure of leading the school for the last twelve years and it is with some trepidation that I prepare to hand over the reins to the new steward of this outstanding institution. Although I will continue to be involved with the school as CEO of the Trust we want the new Headteacher to be have the autonomy to take the school to the next level and not be afraid to introduce changes that will make the provision even better for our young people.

With almost 2000 students at the school this is one of the biggest and most successful schools in the country, with a high profile and strong reputation. There is no doubt that you will need confidence grown from experience and expertise to take on the task, as just managing a school of this size and complexity is quite a challenge. We are looking for more than a manager: we want a *leader* with vision, drive and determination who can work with people to make us all proud of HGS.

You will have the support of a committed, expert and enthusiastic leadership team who really care about the school they lead. The wider staff team is exceptionally talented, with strong teachers and very able support staff colleagues, and we are proud of the fact that we work as one staff team. This strength is also shown in governance and we are fortunate to have governors who are highly capable and understand their role in working with school leaders. You will also join a partnership of generous and ethical leaders who work together as part of the Red Kite Alliance. The Alliance has been a tremendous support for me as a leader at HGS and I am sure it will prove to be so for any new leader. The Trust adds further to that sense of partnership working and provides the day to day support and challenge that will support you to achieve your aims. We see the Trust as a servant of the schools, not the other way around.

Although the school has an Outstanding grade from Ofsted, awarded back in 2007, is it still outstanding and is there work still to be done? We do believe the school would be judged Outstanding if inspected under the current, or 2019 framework, and we have strong evidence to support this view. However, our aim is not just to be Ofsted 'Outstanding' but truly world-class and deliver on excellence in everything we do. There is much still to be done and a new leader will be expected to bring fresh perspectives and new energy to the leadership of the school and make the provision even better for all our young people. No one at HGS believes it is time to take it easy; there is a restless urge to make things better and continue to improve. There are also new challenges brought by the school's expansion and the increasing complexity of the needs of some of our children. The biggest challenge will always be to ensure that all teaching in our school is as good as the best teaching delivered by our best teachers. If we can do that we will achieve excellence for all.

The Red Kite Learning Trust was founded in 2015 to provide a supportive structure for schools working in partnership to help ensure all their young people can achieve success. Its three founding schools were Harrogate Grammar School, Oatlands Junior School and Western Primary School whose aim was, and still is, to work together to ensure Excellence for All.

The Trust has steadily developed with Rossett Acre Primary School joining in November 2016, Crawshaw Academy in March 2017 and Coppice Valley Primary School joining in August 2017. Autumn 2018 is an exciting time for RKLT with another seven schools joining us. RKA includes 16 secondary schools, 3 all-through schools, a special school and 22 primaries. The University of Leeds is a strategic partner, supporting our initial teacher training provision and leadership programmes. Our partnership provides a high quality education for over 28,000 students, with circa 1750 teachers employed in our schools. Our partner schools range from high-achieving suburban academies through to inner city LA schools in more challenging circumstances.

The RKA has a very high profile in regional school improvement, CPL and leadership provision, in addition to its long established involvement in Initial Teacher Training.



The SCITT, known as Red Kite Teacher Training, now has over 100 trainees across primary and secondary, many of whom will find employment within our alliance schools.

Working in partnership with the Yorkshire Leadership Community, RKA provides a full suite of leadership courses from Aspiring Leaders through to Headship and be-

yond. We are accredited providers of the newly reformed National Professional Qualifications enabling us to offer the NPQML (Middle Leaders), NPQSL (Senior Leaders), NPQH (Headship) and NPQEL (Executive Leaders) courses as part of our provision. The work of the Teaching School has been further enhanced and extended with the addition of our Maths Hub status, one of only 35 designated nationally.

Being part of the Red Kite Alliance provides excellent opportunities for staff to work beyond their own school, to collaborate between different partner schools, continually developing and improving their skills.
