Lead in Geography

- Working with school leadership to ensure subject consistency and expectations are high enough
- Identifying and addressing any gaps in achievement.
- Audit the strengths and weaknesses within the subject area
- Ensure that the wider school's aims and policies are put into practice
- Promote and manage positive pupil behaviour both within lessons and around the school site in accordance with the Scholarly Behaviour Policy
- Take responsibility for the safeguarding and welfare of pupils within the school
- Other professional and statutory roles and conduct as expected or requested by the Principal
