

Radnor House Sevenoaks Information

Radnor House Sevenoaks is a fast growing independent co-educational day school educating up to 750 pupils aged 2-18. Located on a beautiful and historic site close to the town of Sevenoaks, Kent, the school was originally founded in 1924 as Combe Bank School before joining the Radnor House Group in 2015, becoming fully co-educational from Nursery to Sixth Form. The school is a member of IAPS and ISA.

Structure

Radnor House Sevenoaks is divided into two sections: Prep School (2-11) and Senior School (11-18) although the emphasis is on providing a 2-18 continuum as pupils progress through each stage of their education.

Co-Curricular

Learning at Radnor House Sevenoaks is not restricted to the classroom and pupils benefit from an extensive range of co-curricular activities designed to engage, broaden and test students both mentally and physically.

Curriculum enrichment activities at Radnor House Sevenoaks include coding, ceramics, debating, film studies, photography, sailing and dance and pupils additionally often participate in external events such The values of Radnor House Sevenoaks permeate as Young Enterprise, The Duke of Edinburgh Award, Kent Chef, Maths Challenge and Young Engineers.

Vision and Values

The vision is for Radnor House Sevenoaks to become House Sevenoaks. a school which truly celebrates the individual providing an active learning environment for limitless minds.

Fostering intellectual curiosity in every individual is at the heart of teaching and learning at Radnor House Sevenoaks. The school offers academic excellence and tailor-made, individual support in the classroom, in the sports arena and throughout an extensive co-curricular programme.

Sports Department Information

Participation in sports at Radnor House Sevenoaks is an integral part of our student's educational experience.

Our sporting programme offers a wide range of opportunities for pupils to develop confident and varied skill sets in an extensive range of sports. Our aim is to develop a strong sporting culture which will lead pupils into a lifelong love of sport whilst staying physically and mentally fit and healthy throughout their lives. The school implements a gender equal approach to sport which provides all boys and girls with the same opportunities in our focus sports of hockey, football, cricket and swimming.

Sport at Radnor House is currently benefiting from huge investment in its sports facilities and staffing. Our sports facilities currently include:

- A full-size sand dressed AstroTurf hockey pitch
- · Newly updated and upgraded fitness suite
- Multi use sports hall with indoor cricket nets.
- 25 metre swimming pool with viewing gallery
- Grass playing fields for cricket, athletics, rugby and football at the Sundridge recreational ground
- Tennis courts
- Netball courts
- Cross country course
- Use of cricket grounds at Sevenoaks Vine CC and Holmesdale CC.

Plans are also in place to develop our own playing fields to include a pavilion, cricket pitch, grass athletics track, rugby and football pitches over the next few years.

The Sports Department is led by our Director of Sport, Tom Butt who manages a dedicated and talented team of staff.





The Role - Director of Football

Radnor House Sevenoaks is an ambitious co-educational independent school that wants to achieve success on the sports field, in additional to success in the classroom.

An exciting new position is offered to develop and lead football for boys and girls at our rapidly growing and forward-thinking school. Radnor House Sevenoaks is a co-educational prep and senior school with high aspirations. The sport at Radnor House Sevenoaks is at an exciting time as a result of growth in pupil numbers and significant investment in sports facilities. Additional staff are being recruited to introduce a gender-equal approach to sport, which will focus on both participation and performance in hockey, football, cricket and swimming for both boys and girls from ages 8-18. The Director of Football will work closely with the Director of Sport, Head of Prep PE and the Directors of Hockey, Cricket and Swimming in developing the school's sports programme with a special focus on leading the football programme.

In September 2020 the school opened its new AstroTurf provides a full-size hockey pitch. The all-weather surface adds to the school's current facilities which include a newly refurbished fitness suite, Sports Hall, a 25-metre swimming pool with viewing gallery, two sets of hard courts and use of extensive grass playing fields. The school plans to develop additional playing fields which will include a pavilion, cricket wicket, grass athletics track, a rugby pitch and football pitches.

Significant potential exists to develop football at Radnor House Sevenoaks with its investment in facilities, staffing and its desire to promote excellence in football for girls and boys equally as one of its focus sports. The Director of Football will enjoy the support of a strong and experienced team of PE teachers and coaches.





Job Description - Director of Football

Job Purpose:

Responsible for the development of girls and boys football across the whole school. Key responsibilities of the role will include, but not be limited to the following:

Job description:

- Create a development plan to progress boys and girls football with the aim of increasing
 participation and improving performance.
- Plan and lead coaching programmes for football
 from ages 8-18.
- Arrange and organise fixtures including logistics
 bookings for all football in the Senior School.
- Develop and lead staff CPD for football.
- Create and develop strong links with local
 football clubs, primary and prep schools.
- Create a strong pre-season football programme, including tours.
- Assist in the delivery of at least one of the summer sports (cricket, athletics or tennis).
- Mentor football players who are in the sport scholarship programme.
