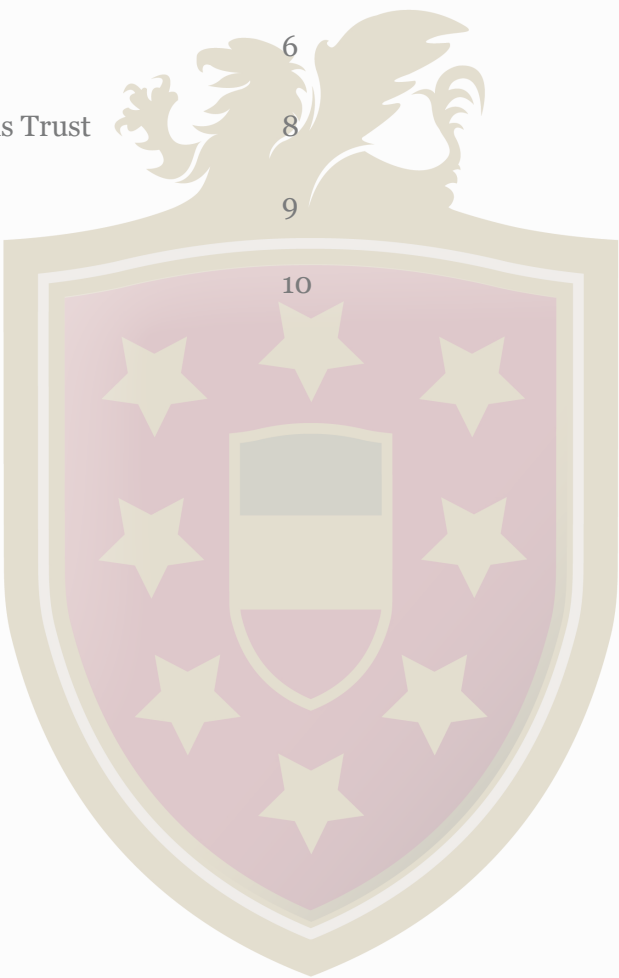

About the Department

PE

This is an exciting time to join our Physical Education department as we move into a new state of the art sports complex with the vision to become a sports hub for the region.

Our facilities include a brand new fitness suite, gymnasium, dance studio and a fully refurbished sports hall. We have a vast range of outdoor facilities including 4 tennis courts, 4 netball courts, 2 rugby and 8 football pitches, grass athletics track and 2 long jump pits. Our facilities are dual use with local football, dance, rugby, archery, netball and trampoline clubs based at school on an evening and our students benefit from our close links to these clubs.

The Physical Education department has 6 full time members of staff, as well as a number of coaches and non PE staff that support extra-curricular activities. Classes are taught in single sex groups at both key stages. Students are taught a broad and balanced curriculum covering all areas of PE including a full range of games, Dance, Gymnastics, OAA and Athletics at both key stage 3 and 4.

PE teachers have the opportunity to teach examination courses across KS4 & 5. We offer both GCSE PE (Edexcel) and BTEC Sport option subjects at Key Stage 4. These courses are a popular choice with students and they achieve well. At Post 16, A-Level Physical Education (AQA) and/or BTEC Sport is taught, along with Sports Enrichment for Post 16 students on a Wednesday afternoon.

As a Griffin School, extra-curricular activities and sport are at the heart of our Wide Horizons and Proud Traditions programme and a commitment to extra-curricular activities by all staff is expected. All clubs and practices are very well attended by both boys and girls. We host and are current winners of the annual Griffin Sports Festival and have school teams in a variety of different sports competing successfully at District, County and National level.

Science

The Science Department is having a boost in November 2019, moving into the new £26million build.

Currently there are 9 full time equivalent staff each who will all have a brand new lab in the new build.

The leadership structure comprises of a Head of Science and Second in Science, some other TLR roles with specific portfolios, with TLR 3 roles available for projects linked to the school or department development plan.

All staff have the opportunity to teach KS3 through to KS5.

The department is fully resourced with appropriate texts and ICT to support learning, i.e. visualizers throughout.

The current exam board of choice for KS4 is AQA, with all students completing GCSE qualifications in either Combined Science (Trilogy) or 3 Separate Sciences. At KS5 we successfully offer OCR A levels in Biology, Chemistry and Physics. We also offer BTEC Level 3 qualifications in both Applied Science and Forensic Science.

The Science department fully support the Wide Horizons agenda with providing many extracurricular activities and opportunities, including our very popular weekly 'Mad Lab' club. We offer many trips and visits throughout the year, including visits to the National Space Centre, local field study centres and the Big Bang Science fair. We are also proud to represent the school in the annual Griffin Science Symposium.

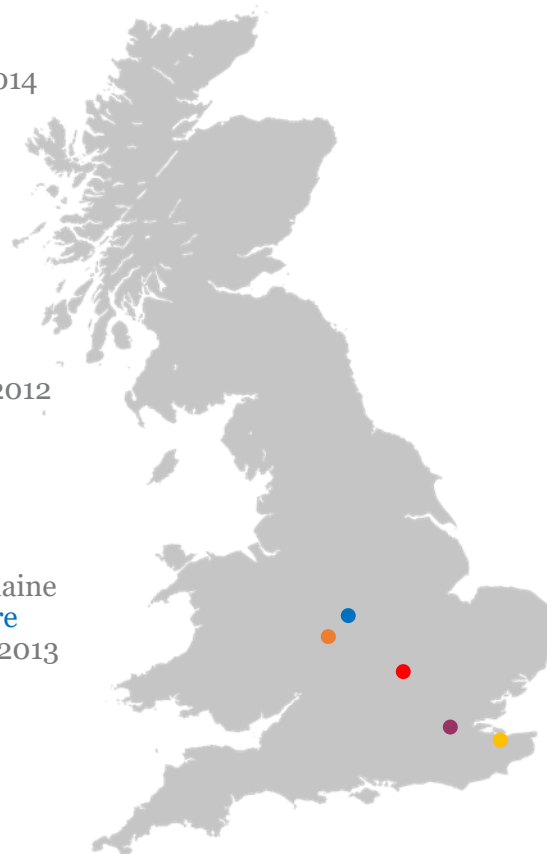

How to Apply

Candidates should submit a CV (including comprehensive details of key achievements and responsibilities) and address the following in no more than 1 side of A4 in 11 point and note that a generic statement will not be considered. Your application will be treated in strict confidence.

- **Give details of how you have had a significant impact on student outcomes (or if you are an NQT how you would plan to) and how you would use this to improve whole school outcomes.**
- **From your research about this school and The Griffin Schools Trust, demonstrate how your experience and track record to date make you the kind of teacher we are looking for.**

Please also include in your application the names, email addresses and direct phone number of two or three professional referees, making clear in what capacity they know you. Unless you ask us not to, we may contact them before the interviews.

The deadline for application is Friday 17 May 2019 by 9.00 am. Interviews are scheduled to take place on Monday 20 May 2019.
